

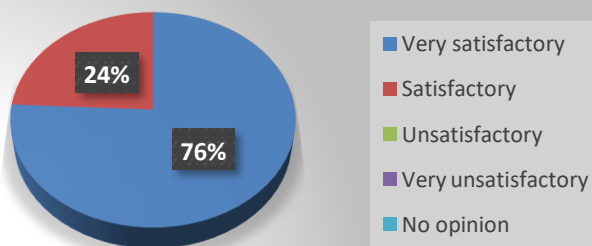
## Evaluation Summary

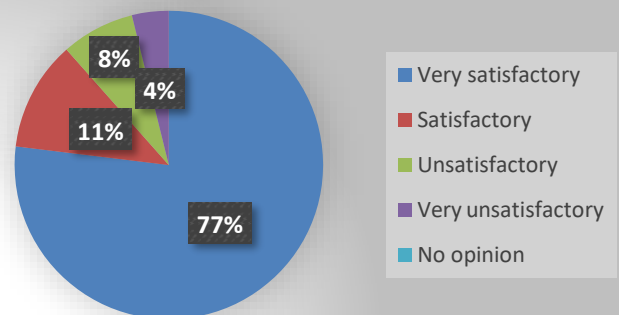

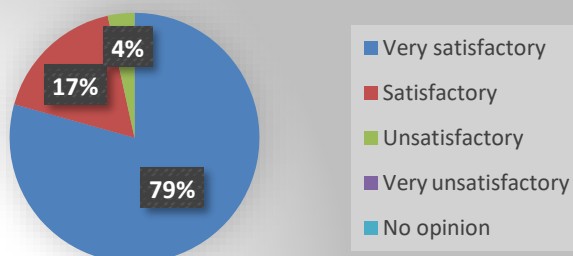

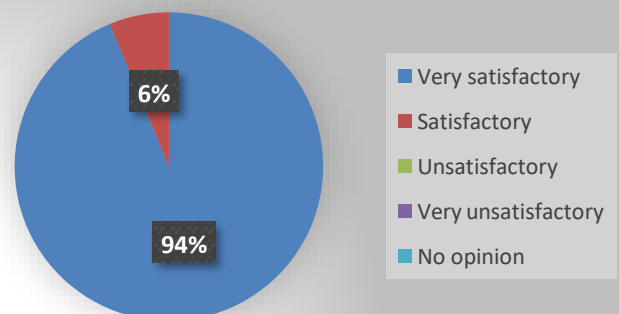

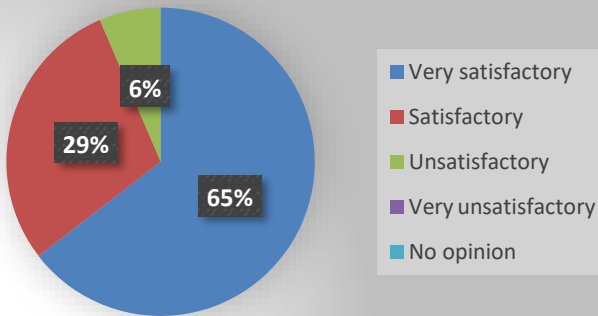

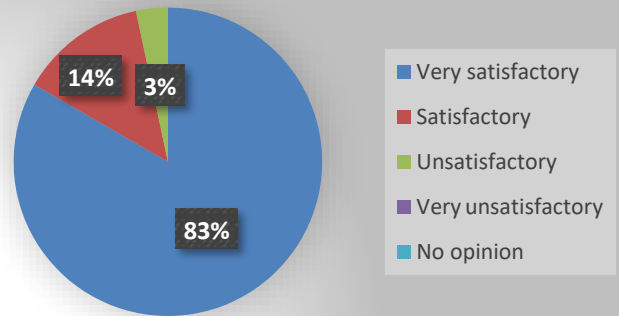

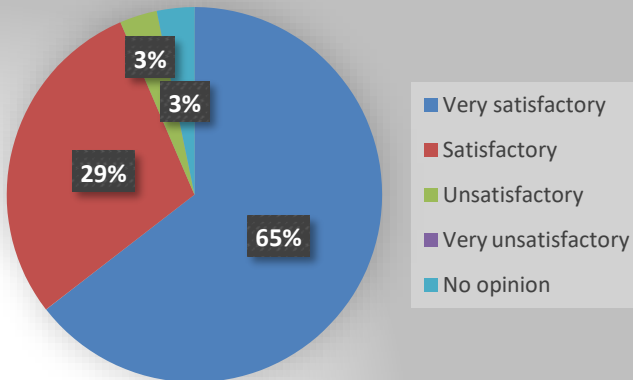

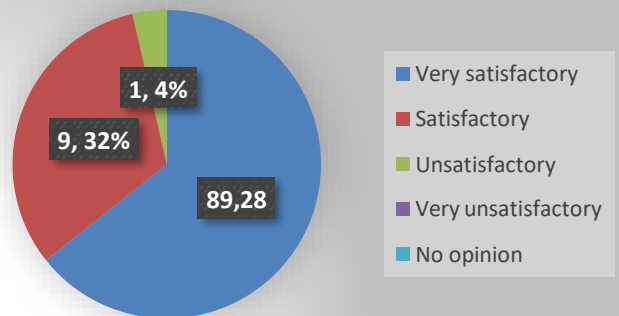

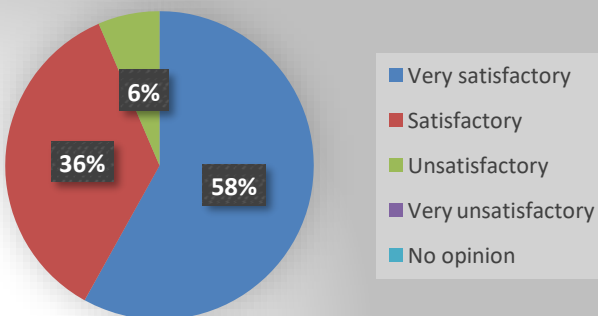

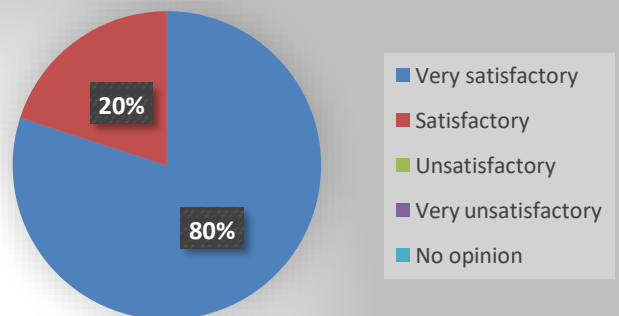

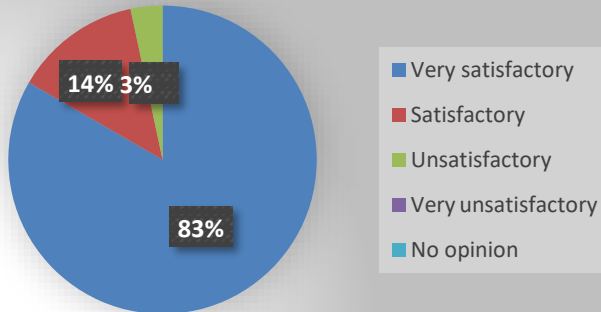

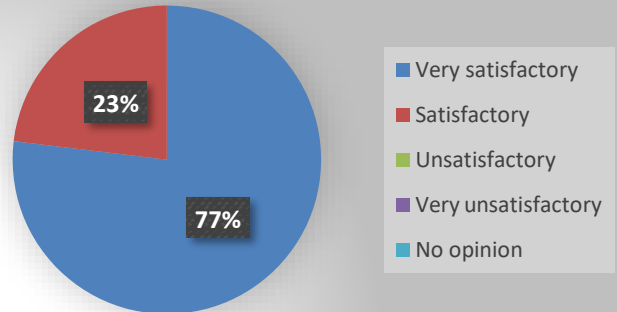

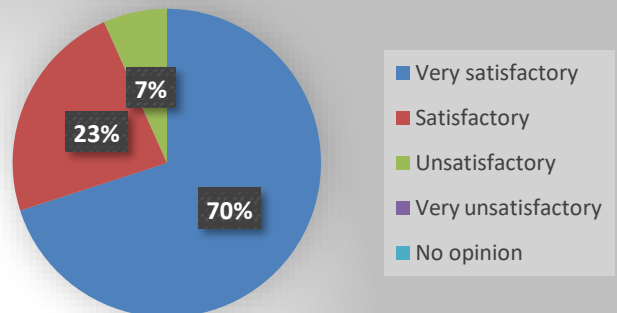

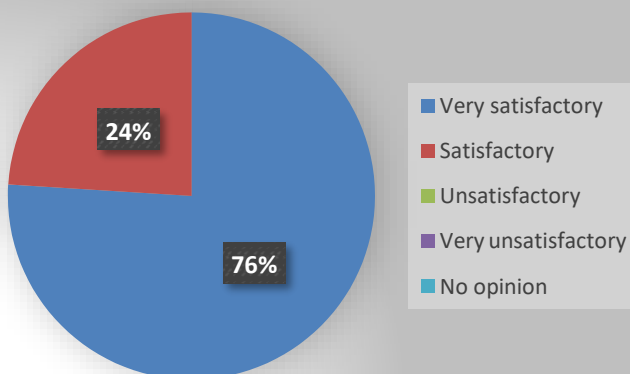

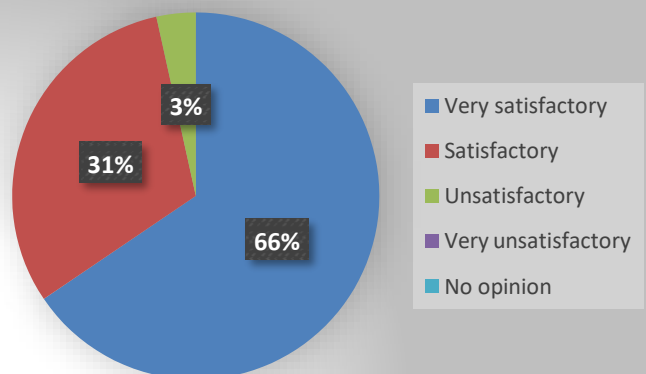

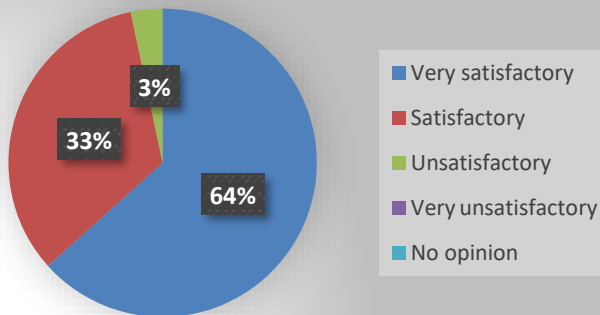

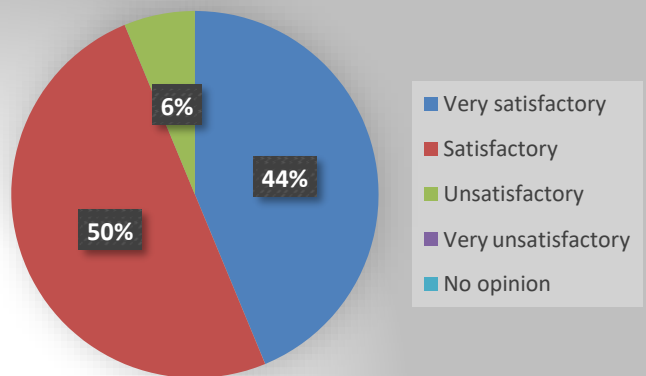

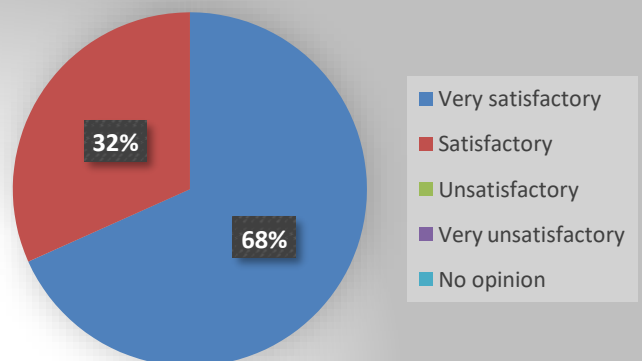

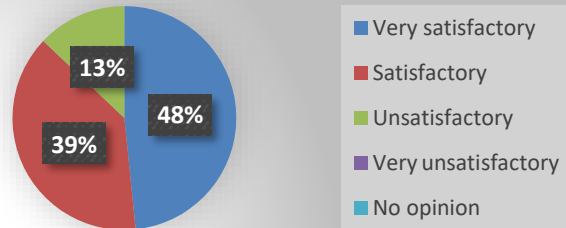

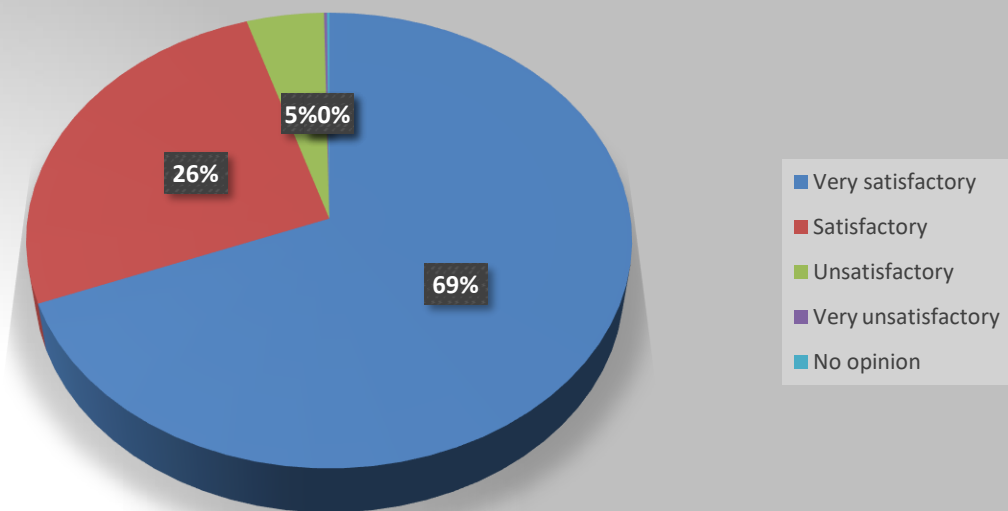

3. It will be better to involve more EU countries to share their experience and practice. Also Industry to introduce their practice in transboundary context.
4. Moldova was a great host! Interesting role play.
5. To conduct such great workshops more often!
6. To add in the presentation template the topic of using geoinformation systems and spatial data when planning.
7. It would be welcomed to include complex approaches and synergies of the related matters.
8. To consider having more time for an informal communication.
9. To dedicate enough time for discussions, follow the allotted time.
10. To invite land use planners (architects, urbanists).
11. More participants – specialist in the land use planning.

#### **What were the main lessons that you learned during the seminar, in relation to land use planning, industrial safety and transboundary cooperation?**

1. Mutual comprehension.
2. Consultation is needed, expert opinions are essential.
3. Transborder cooperation. Many contacts with the professional experts!
4. Cooperation, exchange of the information.
5. Dialogues are the main components with regards to industrial safety and land use planning.
6. It is needed to organize constant and consistent cooperation between the specialists and experts.
7. Exchange of the experience and information.
8. It was useful to exchange the information in the area of land use planning considering hazardous facilities.
9. About the necessity to make changes to the current situation, to eliminate shortcomings.
10. The process is labor intensive, complex, and resource intensive, but it has to be done.
11. It is needed in Belarus to strengthen the work on informing and using the knowledge in the area of land use planning and implementation with regards to the industrial safety.
12. Main lesson is that there exists a problem of aligning actions in the framework of the convention.
