Where environmental health inequalities can affect you

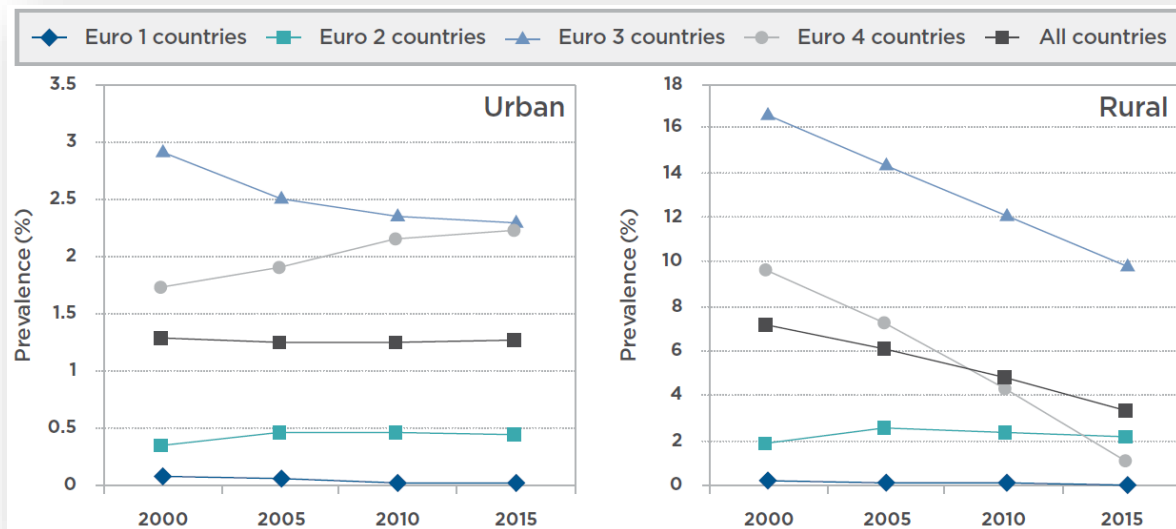


- Magnitude of environmental health inequalities within countries through 19 inequality indicators
- Data from international databases, stratified by socioeconomic, demographic or spatial variables

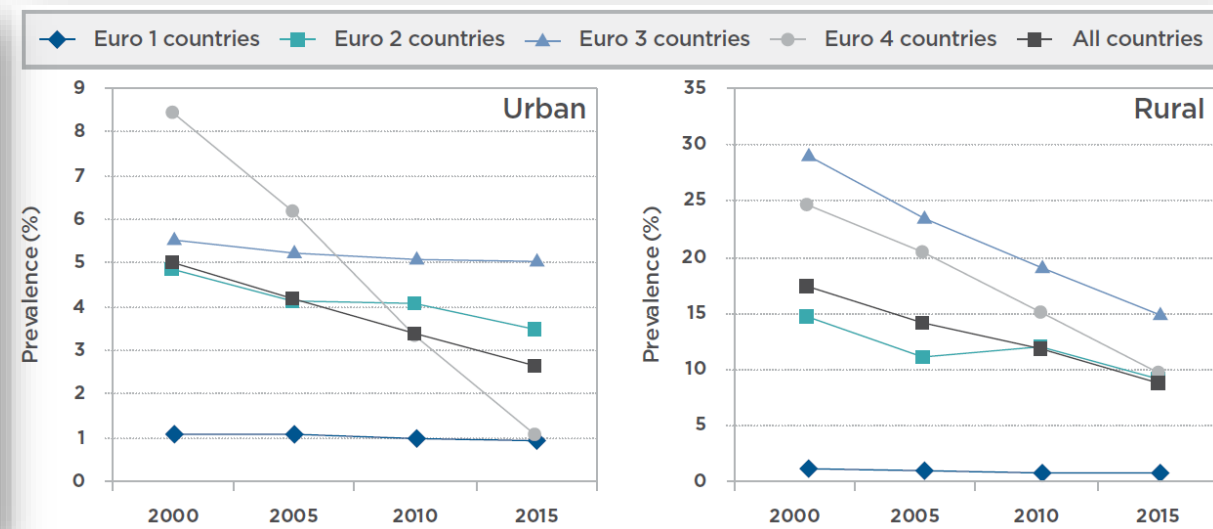
Inequalities in access to basic drinking-water and sanitation services

- Decreasing trend for reliance on less than basic drinking-water and sanitation services

Drinking-water

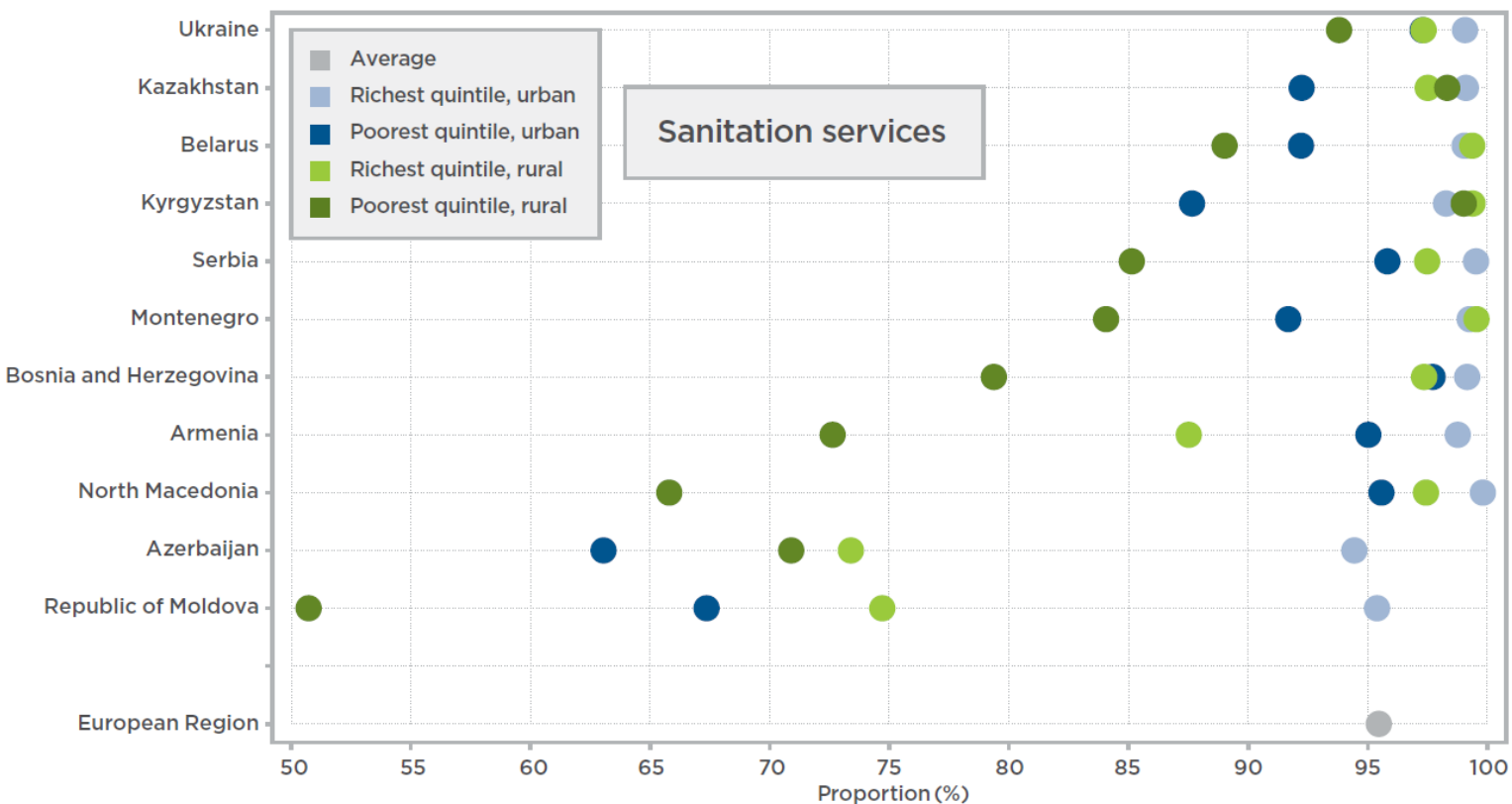


Sanitation



Inequalities in access to basic drinking-water and sanitation services

- Inequalities manifest in three key disparity dimensions: geographical, economic and social.
- Integrated analysis: poor people in rural areas are the most disadvantaged
