Mochovce Nuclear Power Plant in Slovakia

The Mochovce Nuclear Power Plant, owned by Slovenské Elektrárne and Description of issue Enel, is located in the south of the Slovak Republic, Construction of the plant was begun in 1982 and suspended in 1991. Work on two of the four units was restarted in 1995. The first and the second units have been operating from 1998 and 1999 respectively. In 2007 was decided to finish the third and fourth units and construction works are planned to start in 2008¹. The third and fourth units will provide a total installed electrical power of 880 MW. The plant's owners "on a voluntary basis, ... prepared a new EIA Study for the completion of Units 3 & 4 of Mochovce Nuclear Power Plant (MO34 NPP) according to International current practices and European Directives"², completed by September 2007. In the EIA study's summary there is no reference to transboundary impacts or to notification of potentially affected Parties. The European Commission has concluded that "provided that the Commission's recommendations are implemented, the aspects of the investment in question are in line, with the objectives of the Euratom Treaty" 3,4. The Commission made recommendations regarding safety and security aspects. Greenpeace has "condemned" the Commission's opinion that gives a "green light" to the nuclear project. The NGO argues that the Nuclear Power Plant has "serious safety and environmental" implications" and adds that "the Mochovce blueprint dates back to the 1970s and has never been subject to a full independent public assessment, as is required by the Espoo Convention and European
