











Five steps of grid development



- Total length approx.
 5900 km
- DC-corridors: 1.500 to 2.250 km
- Partly to be build as cables
- Federal Network
 Agency is competent
 authority for 16
 projects



Consultation process



- Consultation of the general public,
 NGOs and authorities
- consultation was announced in the internet at www.netzausbau.de, public notes, the newsletter and electronic media
- documents were accessible via internet and in print at the main office of the Federal Network Agency in Bonn for a period of 6 weeks
- public could react to the documents in a written form, by letter or e-mail within a period of 8 weeks in total
- several public information events took place in different cities of Germany


Transboundary consultations



 Early information: before the start of the participation in Germany, the Federal Network Agency informed the Espoo points of contact of all neighbouring states

 All Parties renounced both times to be notified on the NDP, therefore no further transboundary SEA steps took place

 Notification takes place on the next planning level – the routing procedure (for example A-Nord project)





- The first Federal Requirements Plan Act was adopted in in July 2013 and updated in 2015, taking into account the outcome of the participation process and the environmental report respectively.
- In September 2015 the documents were made publicly available on the website www.netzausbau.de jointly with a Summarized Statement.
- The authorities, NGO's and stakeholders were informed individually and received the final documents in a digital or printed version, including the summary.
