Almaty, 20-21 November, 2019

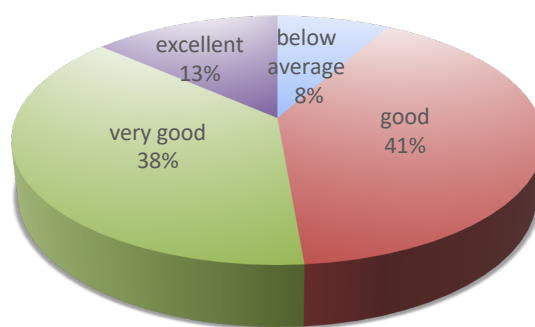

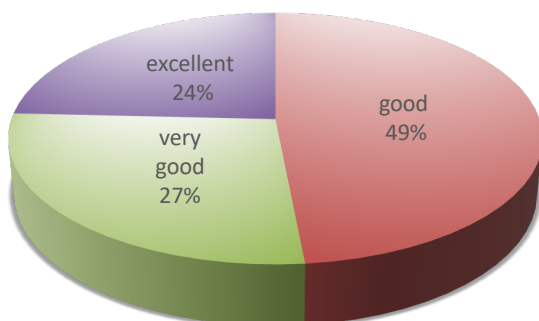

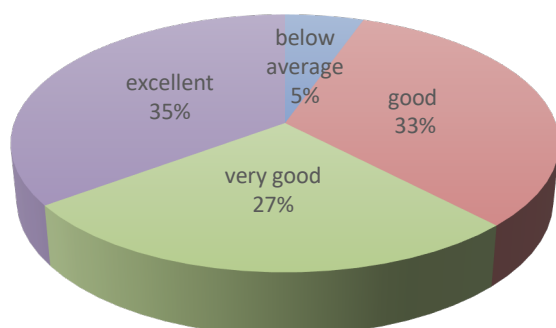
