

## Importance of impact assessment in planning related to greening the economy and in sustainable water management

Side-event on Thursday 22 September, 18:00–19:30 room B-9 in the Palace of Independence

The European Union and UNECE member States have recognized that strategic environmental assessment is a unique and important instrument for planning and policymaking related to greening the economy. They have also invited the Astana Ministerial Conference to take into consideration the importance of strategic environmental assessment in the Conference's two themes of sustainable management of water and water-related ecosystems; and greening the economy: mainstreaming the environment into economic development.\*

This side-event will provide an opportunity to demonstrate the importance of strategic environmental assessment and related impact assessment tools for the Conference themes, with a focus on the countries of Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia. Implementation of the Belgrade Initiative on Strategic Environmental Assessment will also be reported.\*\*

Speakers from Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan will describe their experiences of using impact assessment tools—including project-level environmental impact assessment—to guide development towards sustainability. The speakers will show how participatory methods of integrating the environment into decision-making can bring about better development. A representative of a non-governmental organization will add a civil society perspective. The presentations will be complemented by a six-minute video and the opportunity to pose questions to the panellists. *The agenda is shown overleaf.*
