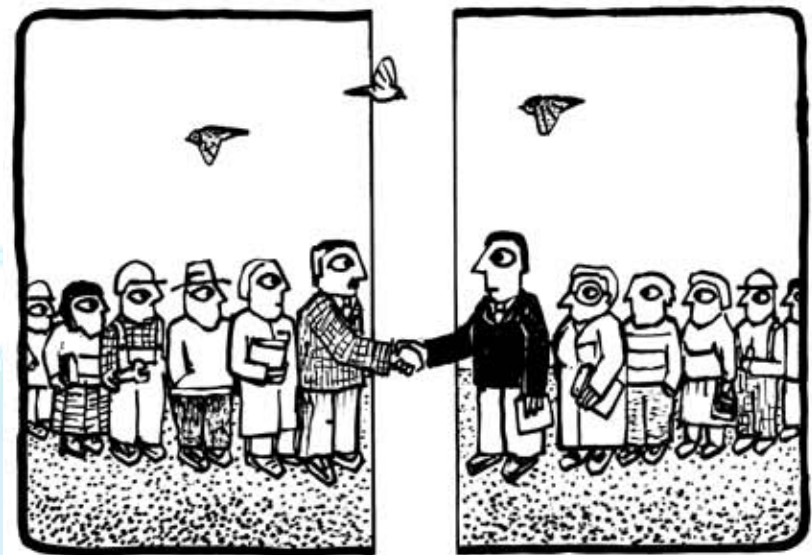

 - Denmark-Finland, Denmark-Sweden, Belgium-Netherlands, Germany-Netherlands, Sweden-Denmark-Germany, Italy-Greece (Poseidon)
