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History

May 2000 - Foreign Ministries of both countries signed an Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria and the Government of Romania on the technical, financial, legal and organisational issues related to the construction of a new cross-border combined (road and rail) bridge over the Danube river

Control 2001 - Ratification of the Agreement by the Parliaments of both countries

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Basis for the EIA procedure

K Art. 3 of the Agreement - "EIA to be done at the stage of the preliminary design and in accordance with the existing legislation in Bulgaria and Romania as well as with the EU Directive on EIA, relevant regional or international conventions and treaties"
