Article 1. Scope of regulation of the law

- 1. This Law establishes a legal basis for regulating issues related to projects and strategic documents, which implementation may have significant impact on the environment, human life or health
- 2. This Law regulates the procedures related to issuance of envronmental impact permit, strategic environmental assessment, public participation in decision-making and transbaoundary environmental impact assessment.







Article 2. Objectives and tasks of the law

Objectives of the Law are:

- to contribute to the protection of the environment and human health as well as of cultural heritage and material assets in the course of implementation of the projects and preparation/approval of strategic documents which may have significant impact on the environment, human health and life;
- to ensure the essential right of a citizen provided by the Constitution of Georgia to receive a complete, objective and timely information as well as to ensure public participation in the course of decision-making in the field of environmental protection in order to promote democratic development of the country.

Tasks of the Law are:

- to determine rights and obligations of the developer, the public concerned and the respective public authorities in the course of decision-making on issues set forth in this.
- to provide the public concerned with information on possible consequences resulting from initiation and implementation of a planned project or strategic document in order to avoid, reduce or mitigate an adverse effect on the environment:
- to determine the rules and procedures to be followed in case of significant transboundary environmental impact.
