Background

The awareness raising workshop on Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is organized by the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Protection of Georgia in cooperation with the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and 'Georgia's Environmental Outlook' (GEO) in the framework of the EU funded Programme 'Greening the Economies in the Eastern Neighbourhood' (EaP GREEN) and the EU Project Support to the Approximation in various fields as part of the environmental provisions under the EU-Georgia Association Agreement.

The aim of the event is to introduce the SEA procedure as stipulated by the draft Environmental Assessment Code of Georgia. The objectives of the workshop can be defined as follows:

- To raise awareness among the sectoral ministries about the recent development of the national legislation on SEA;
- To introduce main benefits of SEA, key stages of SEA process, and roles and responsibilities of main actors involved in SEA;
- To facilitate debate about practical steps and arrangements for application of SEA in Georgia at the national and regional levels after adoption of the Environmental Assessment Code.
