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Outline of scoping procedure

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Main steps in scoping stage i. (according to Environmental Assessment Code)

'Zero' step: planning authority ensures scoping report is prepared

- 1. Planning authority
 - Applies to the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources (MENRP) and the Ministry of Labour, Health and Social Affairs (MLHSA) for scoping opinion
 - Informs public about the application
- 2. MENR and MLHSA publish application and attached documents on their web sites
- 3. MENR establishes expert commission









Main steps in scoping stage ii. (according to Environmental Assessment Code)

- 4. Planning authority ensures organization of scoping public hearing
- MENRP, MLHSA, and planning authority inform about time and place of public hearing
- Expert commission provides conclusions on scoping report
- 7. MENRP and MLHSA submit their view and notes on strategic document at the public hearing
- 8. Planning authority prepares protocol on public hearing and submits it to MENRP and MLHSA









Main steps in scoping stage iii. (according to Environmental Assessment Code)

- 9. MENRP and MLHSA issue the scoping opinion
- 10. MENRP and MLHSA send scoping opinion to planning authority
- 11. MENRP, MLHSA, and planning authority publish scoping opinion on their official websites within 5 days after it is issued









Issues for discussion – general aspects

- Purpose of scoping: not to 'approve' scoping report,
 but to determine scope of assessment
- Role of expert commission: primarily to suggest (based on the scoping report) the scope of assessment
- Role of MENRP and MLHSA: Based on scoping report, expert commission's outputs and scoping public hearing to determine the scope of assessment – both from substantial and procedural points of view









Issues for discussion – technical aspects

- Application by planning authority any format to be prescribed?
- Way of communication/cooperation between MENRP and MLHSA when
 - Communicating to the planning authority
 - Publishing information and documents
 - Establishing and coordinating expert commission
 - Preparing and issuing scoping opinion
- Composition of the expert commission who will decide about it?









Issues for discussion – technical aspects

- Information about time and venue of the scoping public hearing
 - Scoping application should already suggest timing and venue of the scoping public hearing, but...
 - MENRP, MLHSA, and planning authority shall publish this information no later than 20 working days before public hearing
- Publishing scoping opinion
 - MENRP and MLHSA send scoping opinion to planning authority, and it needs to be published on their official websites within 5 days after it is issued
 - Will planning authority have scoping opinion in time?











Issues for discussion – technical aspects

Timing of entire scoping procedure (max. 50 working days in total)

- Day 0: Registration of application
- Information about public hearing is published (in 5 days?)
- In 10 days: Expert commission is established
- Expert commission's conclusions on scoping report (10 days before scoping hearing)
- Scoping hearing (at least 20 days after publishing information about place and time)
- Protocol on public hearing (3 days after public hearing)
- MENRP/MLHSA issues scoping opinion











Suggestions for practical implementation of scoping procedure

- Unified way of informing public should be clearly defined
 - Websites of planning agency, MENR, MLHSA
 - Other ways?
- Optional expert commission involvement in scoping: Scope of assessment can be determined directly by the MENRP and MLHSA in less complicated cases
- Optional public hearing in scoping: Can be replaced by targeted consultations with key stakeholders
