

Training workshop on SEA scoping in Georgia for the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Protection and the Ministry of Labour, Health and Social Affairs

April 19, 2016 Venue: Hotel Betsy's, 32/34 Kote Makashvili St, Tbilisi, Georgia

Background

The training workshop on SEA scoping is organized by the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Protection of Georgia in cooperation with the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and 'Georgia's Environmental Outlook' (GEO) in the framework of the EU funded Programme 'Greening the Economies in the Eastern Neighbourhood' (EaP GREEN).

The aim of the training workshop is to revisit practical aspects of conducting SEA scoping with special emphasis on the role of environmental and health authorities in scoping, as well as on the formulation of a scoping opinion, as stipulated by the draft Environmental Assessment Code of Georgia.

After the training workshop the participants should be able to assess the relevance of information that is provided in the SEA scoping report, as well as to to develop a scoping opinion. The conclusions from the workshop should also support both ministries in developing a detailed procedure for cooperation between the environmental and health authorities during the SEA process.

The outcomes of the training workshop will be incorporated into the practical recommendations on the application of SEA in Georgia according to the draft Environmental Assessment Code.

Participants

The training workshop is designed for officials from the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Protection of Georgia and the Ministry of Labour, Health and Social Affairs of Georgia, who are the authorities to play a major role in the SEA system after the adoption of the Environmental Assessment Code¹.

Approach and design

The training will be delivered by a national SEA expert supported by an international UNECE consultant(s). The experience gained during the pilot SEA application to the National Waste Management Action Plan (and Strategy) in Georgia will be utilized to a large extent as a basis for exercises and discussions. In addition, other SEA scoping reports a(prepared within the SEA pilots in other EaP GREEN countries as well as from the EU countries) will also be provided to present a broader perspective on the possible SEA approaches to drafting the scoping reports that may be received by the environmental and health authorities when a full-fledge SEA scheme is established in the country.

¹ The draft EAC requires cooperation of environmental and health authorities within the SEA process (e.g. Art. 23.6 or Art. 25.6).



Home assignment

- Read the SEA pilot scoping report provided by the training experts;
- Read the relevant sections of the EAC (i.e. Art. 22 26);
- Formulate 2 4 specific questions related to scoping which should be addressed at the workshop and send proposals to the organizers

After the training, the participants will be asked to finalize scoping opinion for the SEA pilot scoping report (to be elaborated during the workshop), and send it to the national coordinator for providing feedback by the trainers. The feedback to the home assignment will be provided by the trainers in written form. In addition, a short follow-up session will be organized to discuss the results of the workshop (via Skype or within subsequent SEA/EIA-related activities in Georgia within the framework of the EaP GREEN project).
