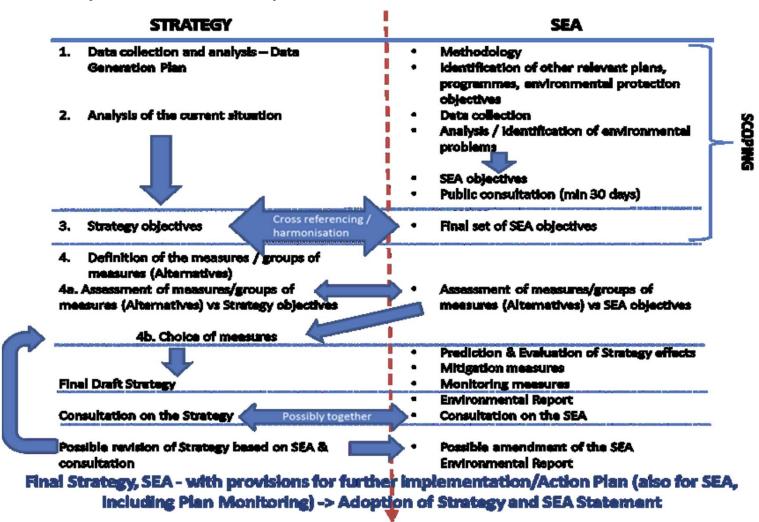
- ☐ Law on ratification of Espoo Convention 1996
- ☐ Law on ratification of SEA Protocol **2009**
- Neighboring countries:
 Slovenia, Hungary, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Italy
- ☐ Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina



- major transport document
- ex ante conditionality for the programming period 2014-2020, basis for EU financing of all transport projects up to 2016 (Structural funds, Cohesion fund, CEF, EIB and EBRD loans)
- ☐ investment decisions based on accurate and complete data for all transport sectors

- assess and define the future measures (infrastructure, operation and organization) in the transport sector related to international and national transport
- □ provide the framework for the development of interventions and define the interfaces to other strategies or assessments (Functional Regional Concepts-FRC, Master Plans, sectorial strategies, etc.).
- □ take into account the European strategies and requirements (TEN-T, ERTMS, TSI, environmental protection, climate protection etc. general objectives) and be based on a thorough analysis of the Croatian situation (specific objectives for Croatia).

- MSTI May 2015 decision to start SEApublic informed
- scoping May September 2015
 - competent authorities
 - public
 - MEE points to possible cross-border impacts
- February 2016 SEA Report under preparation
 notification: Bosnia and Herzegovina,
 Hungary, Italy, Montenegro, Serbia,
 Slovenia

- Hungary
 - states interest in consultations
 - issue of water transport development (ecological status of bordering rivers Mura and Drava)
 - advises that in order to speed up the process, the entire documentation should be in Hungarian
- Italy
 - states interest in consultations
 - requests non-technical summary in Italian language

- Serbia
 - states interest in consultations
- Montenegro
 - states interest in consultations
 - documents have to be send no later than when informing Croatian public
- Bosnia and Herzegovina
 - states interest in consultations
 - air pollution related to road transport, ecological state of bordering rivers
- Slovenia
 - not respond to the notification

- public participation in Croatia started in June 2017
- ☐ June 2017 documentation (ER & draft of TDS) sent to countries that have expressed interest
- ☐ June August 2017 consultation
- □ end of August 2017 TDS sent to the Government's procedure

Main challenges and problems

- different competent authorities for TDS and SEA
- different legal procedures
- higher costs (translations)
- □ lack of early informal consultations formal consultation after scoping
- □ some of the major transport projects have been already subjects od transboundary EIA's (!?)
