## **EaP GREEN**

Greening Economies in the Eastern Neighbourhood (EaP GREEN) programme is a large regional programme implemented in 2013-2017 by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), OECD, UNEP, and UNIDO to assist the six European Union's Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, the Republic of Moldova and Ukraine, in their transition to green economy.

The programme is financed by the European Commission, the four implementing organisations and other donors.









## **EaP GREEN**

The programme's overall objective is to assist the EaP countries to decouple economic growth from environmental degradation and resource depletion.

The programme component that ECE is in charge of implementing, aims to promote the use of strategic environmental assessment (SEA) and environmental impact assessment (EIA) as essential planning tools for an environmentally sustainable economic development.









## **SEA/EIA work-streams**

- Revision of the existing national regulatory and legislative framework
  - Legal reviews and legal drafting
- Capacity building on SEA/EIA procedures
  - Trainings and workshops (national and sub-regional)
  - SEA/EIA pilots
- Strengthening of administrative capacities
  - Facilitating policy dialogue
  - Recommendations on institutional framework for SEA/EIA
























## Major outputs and achievements

Establishing legislative framework for SEA and EIA

Draft legislation in intergovernmental discussion or submitted for adoption

 Draft legislation on EIA and SEA was revised, improved and submitted to the Cabinet of Ministers of Azerbaijan Republic

Implementing SEA/EIA pilots

SEA/EIA pilots finalized

 A number of persons gained theoretical knowledge on SEA, awareness raised on SEA among governmental authorities and civil society

Preparing national SEA guidelines

National SEA guidelines to be finalized in 2017

SEA was applied to the National strategy on alternative and renewable energy use following major steps outlined by the Protocol on SEA

Organizing trainings on SEA

Participation of the country representatives at the sub-regional events

 Preparation of SEA recommendation paper was initiated, the final draft shall foster implementation of the SEA legislation









## Challenges and priorities



To draft and adopt secondary legislation



 To improve institutional capacity of State Expertize Department of Ministry of Ecology and Natural Resources



• To raise awareness among the universities and civil society



• To prepare guidelines on SEA for proponents, and/or relevant governmental authority individually



To train civil servants on SEA and EIA



 To introduce electronic portal to enhance availability of environmental data and information on SEA/EIA/SEE procedures
