Background

The plans and programmes at the local level (in particular, spatial plans) represent an important group of strategic documents the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) should be applied to. A number of municipalities in Georgia have already launched preparation of the local spatial plans and others will initiate the planning process in the course of 2019. Therefore, there is an obvious demand for the technical assistance to ensure the local-level SEAs are conducted in accordance with the new national legislative framework. This event is organized within the EU-funded "European Union for Environment" (EU4Environment) with co-funding from the Czech Republic.

The workshop will focus on the preparation of SEA report (including relevant analyses), quality control in SEA, and preparation of SEA recommendations as the final step of the SEA process in accordance with the Environmental Assessment Code of Georgia (EAC). It will be based on the ongoing SEA of the Resort Lebarde Development Regulation draft Plan. The workshop will build on the outcomes of the first training workshop organised by UNECE in cooperation with the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Agriculture on 16-17 May 2019 in Tbilisi (https://www.unece.org/index.php?id=51475).

Meeting objectives, expected outputs and outcomes

- enhance capacities for the application of SEA in Georgia in line with the requirements
 of the UNECE Protocol on SEA and EU SEA Directive, which Georgia has transposed
 into the national legislative framework through the adoption of the EAC;
- follow up and build on the outcomes of the first training workshop
- facilitate the ongoing SEA of the Resort Lebarde Development Regulation draft Plan.

Up to 40 staff of the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Agriculture, National Environmental Agency, Ministry of Regional Development and Infrastructure, Ministry of Health and Social Affairs, Tbilisi City Hall and other selected municipalities.
