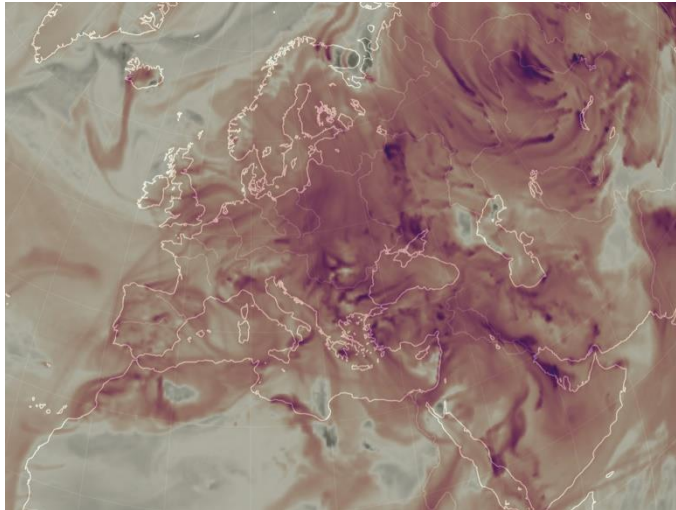

“Transboundary Environmental Impact Assessment of coal and lignite-related activities”

Emissions from coal and lignite activities know no boundaries and cause significant adverse transboundary impacts on people’s health, the environment and the climate. However, the need to subject these activities to transboundary impact assessments is largely neglected by the involved parties. Planned projects often escape the crucial notification requirements to the detriment of affected countries.

ClientEarth will examine the adverse transboundary impacts of large combustion coal and lignite power plants and mines, and the legal obligations they trigger under the Espoo Convention.
