Summary

The present document provides background for the Working Group on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment to discuss, during its twenty-second session, its future mandate and terms of reference. The Working Group will be invited to consider the draft set out below, agree on changes and determine next steps. Those steps could begin with a survey among members of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) Committee on Environmental Policy. Upon receiving feedback from members of the Committee, the draft terms of reference would be revised, approved by the Working Group and submitted for consideration by the Committee and subsequently to the ECE Executive Committee for approval. The present draft was prepared based on the current terms of reference, outcomes of past sessions of the Working Group, written feedback provided by member States in May 2020 and the questionnaire and publication Sharing our vision for the pan-European region: Setting strategic goals and objectives for the Working Group on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment, which emphasizes strategic goals and objectives up to 2030.*

- Other relevant policies such as multilateral environmental agreements incl. UNECE Conventions, Paris Agreement, Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and transition to a circular economy
- Questionnaire & publication Sharing our vision for the pan-European region: Setting strategic goals and objectives for the Working Group on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment, up to 2030
- Feedback received by UNECE member States and international partners in May 2020
- Common approach of UNECE-EEA-UNEP







Mandate:

 Working Group shall serve as the environmental knowledge and assessment network for whole UNECE region, to aid informed decision-making in support of the transition to sustainable development (SD) & a green & circular economy (GE & CE) in the UNECE region.

Overall Objective (in cooperation with partners):

 to enable informed environmental decision-making monitoring, assessment and reporting to support sustainable development and a green and circular economy.

Specific objectives in cooperation with partners & Joint Task Force & under oversight of CEP:

- a) Support development of environmental monitoring & information systems and their alignment with SEIS principles
- b) Enable a consultative process on regular pan-European environmental assessments & streamlining of regular state-of-the-environment reporting by 2026 in support of SD, GE & CE & implementation of outcomes of 9th EfE Ministerial Conference
- c) Facilitate consultation between ECE member States, partner organizations and other institutions & networks with relevant expertise in the area & provide an inclusive platform for countries to discuss developments in monitoring and assessment and integration of environmental, economic & social information & data with regard to









Specific objectives (continued):

- a) Enable **development of capacity** to tackle challenges in environmental monitoring and assessment (incl. development & improvement of environmental monitoring systems, their technical specifications & modernization, financing, collection of environmental knowledge through national monitoring systems & other mechanisms & technologies) in support of SD, GE & CE
- b) **Engage** as **partners** UNEP, its network & other organizations and programmes within UN, institutions of the EU, incl. the European Commission and EEA & its EIONET, OECD etc.

Lead a process of consultation on regular pan-European environmental assessment & streamlining of regular state-of-the-environment reporting

Bring together experts (partner organizations & others) to discuss & oversee regular pan-European environmental assessment

Discuss and detail regional priorities concerning the streamlining of regular state-of-the-environment reporting

Oversee implementation of proposed recommendations & guidance provided through consultation process

Continue consultation between UNECE member States, partners & other institutions & networks, incl. MEAs, IFIs, private sector & provide an inclusive platform for countries

Cooperate with JTF & other relevant UNECE bodies incl. Housing & Land Management, Population, Sustainable Energy & Transport, to ensure that activities are synergetic & streamlined

Engage with other communities & networks for enhanced integration of socio-economic & environmental data & utilization in decision-making & presentation of environmental information on geospatial platforms

Publish outcomes from Working Group's collaborative activities (e.g. best practices, guidelines & lessons learned) Engage in capacity-development assistance on environmental monitoring and assessment & environmental knowledge

Detailing regional and national capacity gaps, in collaboration with Joint Task Force (gaps in monitoring, data availability for indicator production)

Supporting countries in development & implementation of regional & national indicator frameworks

Engaging & liaising with other knowledge-sharing actors working on capacity-development in related areas of work

Implementing capacity-development activities





Planned outputs until 2026



- Updated guidelines for application of environmental indicators (with Joint Task Force)
- Assistance to target countries for regular reporting on SEIS (to address gaps), if needed
- Recommendations & advice to UNECE countries for improved environmental monitoring & information systems, aligned with SEIS principles
- Assistance for preparation of regular pan-European environmental assessment & other relevant state-of-theenvironment reports
- Support for implementation of indicator frameworks (national, regional)
- Thematic conferences, meetings, workshops & publications on integration of environmental, social & economic data, subject to availability of funding
- Support in assessing regional & national capacity gaps in environmental monitoring, information & data needed for producing environmental indicators;




