Introduction

The Chair of the session will introduce organization of work during the thematic session and the main topics for discussion. The thematic session on the promotion of the principles of the Aarhus Convention in international forums will include panel presentations and round table discussion on:

- (a) Promoting the principles of the Aarhus Convention in the international trade negotiations; and
- (b) Promoting the principles of the Aarhus Convention in International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) processes.

In addition, the Working Group will consider any recent developments (e.g. related to the issue of geoengineering and implications linked to COVID-19 pandemic)³. Further, based on written submissions, the Working Group will consider any updates with regard to items discussed at previous thematic sessions, including:

- (a) Climate-related processes with the focus on lessons learnt from the twenty-fifth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP-25) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and preparations for COP-26;
- (b) Policies on access to information and on stakeholder engagement of the United Nations Environment Assembly of the United Nations Environment Programme;
- (c) Policies and activities of international financial institutions;
- (d) Sustainable Development Goals-related processes.

I. Promotion of the Convention's principles in the international trade negotiations

Timing: 12.10-13.00 and 15.00-15.20

This item will be organized in the format of a panel presentation and round-table discussion. The focus of this session is to review the promotion of the Convention's principles in the international trade negotiations. The Working Group will consider in this regard a number of issues, including how Aarhus Parties have promoted the principles of the Convention in the international trade negotiations; what are the benefits of public participation at national and international level; ways to increase transparency of the processes and good available practices that could be used as model examples for improving ongoing or future negotiation processes; as well as possible challenges. The discussion is expected to address issues related to national and international levels of trade negotiations; and national coordination mechanisms and other measures by Parties in the context of international trade negotiations.
