review of the results achieved by EECCA and SEE countries under the preparatory phase as contained in the report ECE/CP.TEIA/2006/3


adoption of the report and initiation of the implementation phase for those EECCA and SEE countries that had accomplished their preparations (implemented basic tasks)

request to the Bureau to continue preparatory phase and to provide assistance to those countries which felt unable to implement basic tasks








EFFECTS OF INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS



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## **Preparatory phase in 2007-2008** Outcome of the fact-finding missions

- Croatia, Kazakhstan and Serbia implemented all basic tasks
- Uzbekistan failed to implement two tasks

Decisions of the Bureau of the CoP:

- Croatia, Kazakhstan and Serbia invited to the implementation phase of the Assistance Programme,
- Uzbekistan invited to accomplish the implementation of basic tasks

## **Preparatory phase in 2007-2008** Outcome of the fact-finding missions

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## **Identified needs for assistance**

- Many needs shared by countries (also true when compared to missions organized in 2006)
- Most quoted needs
  - identification of hazardous activities
  - implementation of preventive measures
  - training and education for inspectors in assessing quality of safety reports, risk assessment
    - assessment of legal and institutional frameworks
    - enhancement of preparedness measures



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## **Preparatory phase in 2007-2008** Guidance on implementing basic tasks

### Awareness-raising missions to:

• (a) Raise awareness among the country's authorities about the purpose and provisions of the Convention and ensure common understanding of the basic tasks;

 (b) Provide the necessary assistance to the country's authorities so that they will be able to establish a plan of action aimed at the implementation of the basic tasks under the Convention, including a time frame for its completion

Geneva, 25-27 Nov 2008 Awareness-raising team – four experts with practical experience in implementing different provisions of the Convention

During the mission – one meeting with all authorities charged with prevention, preparedness and response aspects of industrial accidents

## Preparatory phase in 2007-2008 Outcome of the awareness-raising mission to tfYR of Macedonia

Results:

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- Better understanding of the tasks under the Convention
- Establishment of a national working group to prepare an action plan and implement it

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- Action plan submitted to the Bureau in March 2008, Bureau welcomed it and invited the country to present the action plan and the progress in implementation to the CoP
- Ms. Emilija Kupeva from tfYR of Macedonia will introduce the action plan and its implementation

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Geneva, 25-27 Nov 2008 Georgia, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan submitted their reports

No report from Tajikistan


Albania expressed commitment

- Albania invited to host fact-finding mission










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

# **Implementation phase** Capacity building activities

Way of work:

V MEETING OF THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES For each assistance activity a concept is being elaborated, which is discussed by the Bureau and WGI

Assistance activities are implemented in line with the agreed concepts

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Common issues for the activities:

- Need to be hands-on analysis and discussion
- Need to initiate processes demanding follow-up (continuous efforts from countries)
- External experts take role as activities' facilitators

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# **Implementation phase** Capacity building activities

## Outcome of Kyiv Activity

- Better understanding of tasks under each of the areas of work of the Convention

- Basis for identification of shortcomings and for preparing action plans (but needs for further mechanisms which would allow working in a structured way)

- Action plans were developed and are/should be under continues review

- Better understanding on legislation on safety, model administrative structure, safety culture
- Continuation of the analysis of Kyiv and basis for the training session on the integrated approach for major hazard prevention (under preparations led by the Czech Republic)

# **Implementation phase** Capacity building activities

Training session on identification of hazardous activities according to annex I of the Convention – Minsk 21-22 October 2008

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Objective: build-up knowledge on use of annex I, location criteria, analysis of possible worst case scenarios for the identification of hazardous activities, discuss good practice regarding collecting, processing, maintaining and updating data on hazardous activities

Geneva, 25-27 Nov 2008 Participation: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Croatia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Republic of Moldova, Serbia and Ukraine

External Experts: Bulgaria, Italy, the Netherlands, Slovakia and Switzerland

# **Implementation phase** Capacity building activities

## **Outcome of Minsk Activity**

- Identification of shortcomings in systems for collecting, processing and maintaining data

- Better understanding of use of annex I, location criteria and worst-case scenario methodology

- Follow-up – review of list of hazardous activities based on application of annex I location criteria (where needed review of classification rules to be in line with the Convention), national training sessions

- Identification of further needs – access to information on classification on chemicals, guidebook through identification, assistance in organizing training sessions, training sessions on risk assessment

Follow-up and the needs to be incorporated into the national action plans

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# **Implementation phase** Capacity building activities

## **Upcoming activities:**

-Training session on integrated approach for major hazard prevention under lead of Czech Republic – February 2009 in Prague (invitation letters circulated)

 Project on joint management to emergencies under the lead of Italy – kick off meeting in beginning of 2009





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# **Implementation phase** Strategic approach

- Task of the Bureau and WGI – carried-out by a task force (members from: Bulgaria, Italy, Lithuania, the Netherlands, and at later stage European Commission and Switzerland)

- Strategic approach is presented in ECE/CP.TEIA/2008/5

- Presentation by Mr. Nikolay Savov – member of the task force, on the strategic approach

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## Conclusions and recommendations of the Implementation phase

- So far quite successful – initiation of important processes aimed at further strengthening the Convention's implementation

To keep momentum – the work needs to be continued

- For those countries, who are still not in the implementation phase, activities as already organized should be also offered

Strategic approach (its mechanisms) to:

bring more structure to the work

lead to further intensification to strengthening the implementation of the Convention
