

## Executive summary

Bosnia and Herzegovina is established and internationally recognised as a state consisting of two entities: the Federation of Bosnia Herzegovina (FBiH) and Republika Srpska (RS), each with its own constitution. In addition to the two Entities, the Brcko Final Arbitration Award of the 5th March 1999 established a neutral District with substantial legislative and administrative autonomy.

Consequently the vertical division of political and administrative power entails three levels: state level (level of BiH), entity level (FBiH, RS and District Brcko) and cantonal level (the ten cantons of the FBiH).

BiH is a potential candidate country for EU accession following the Thessaloniki European Council of June 2003. On 16 June 2008 the EU and BiH signed Stabilisation and Association Agreement (SAA). BiH formally applied for EU membership on 15 February 2016.

The legislative basis at level of BiH which regulates water protection and water resources management and health policy is mainly related to the quality of drinking water for human use and monitoring of radioactivity in the environment, including radioactivity in surface waters and sources of drinking water, while the other water related and health issues are regulated by legal framework at entity level.

Pursuant to Article 9, Paragraph (2) of the Law on Ministries and Other Bodies of Administration of Bosnia and Herzegovina<sup>1</sup>, the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Relations of BiH is responsible for performing actions and tasks within the jurisdiction of Bosnia and Herzegovina related to policy definition, basic principles, coordination of activities and harmonization of plans of the entity level authorities and institutions at the international level in the areas of environmental protection, development and usage of natural resources.

Article 15, Paragraph (3) of the Law on Ministries and Other Bodies of Administration of Bosnia and Herzegovina stipulates that the Ministry of Civil Affairs of BiH is competent for performing actions and performing tasks that are within the competence of Bosnia and Herzegovina and which relate to establishing the basic principles of coordination of activities, harmonization of plans of the entity authorities and the definition of a strategy at the international level in the fields of health and social welfare.

The Protocol on Water and Health under the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (hereinafter: The Protocol) entered into force in Bosnia and Herzegovina on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2012.

In accordance with Article 6, paragraph (2) of the Protocol, each signatory country of the Protocol is obliged to establish and publish the objectives in view of: access to drinking water

for everyone, and to ensure sanitary measures within integrated water management systems aimed at sustainable use of water resources that do not endanger human health.

Pursuant to Article 6, paragraph (5), point (a) of the Protocol, each Party (signatory to the Protocol) is obliged to establish an appropriate system of coordination and cooperation between the competent institutions in order to achieve the objectives in accordance with Article 6, paragraph (2) of the Protocol.

**Responsible body/coordinating body and process:**

Bosnia and Herzegovina has been part of the Consultation Process under the Compliance Committee of the Protocol Water and Health, on 20 October 2015. Having in mind suggestion and advice of the Committee and in order to fulfil obligations under the Protocol, on February 15, 2017, the Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Relations of Bosnia and Herzegovina issued a Decision appointing members of the Working Group to monitor the implementation of Bosnia and Herzegovina's obligations under the Protocol on Water and Health under the UN Convention on Protection and the Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (hereinafter referred to as the "Working Group").

The Working Group for drafting the targets is led by the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Relations of BiH and consist of representatives of all responsible institutions in BiH in field of environment and health.

In accordance with Article 2 of the Decision, the Working Group is tasked with:

- (1) preparing proposal of targets in accordance with Article 6, paragraph (2) of the Protocol, defined in accordance with the adopted legal, regulatory and strategic documents of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Republika Srpska, in order to achieve the purpose of the Protocol;
- (2) defining indicators in order to monitor progress towards the achievement of set targets;
- (3) proposing deadlines for achieving the targets in accordance with the relevant strategic documents of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Republika Srpska in accordance with Article 6, paragraph (3) of the Protocol;
- (4) agreeing on a method of collecting data to evaluate progress towards the achievement of the set targets, and informing the Secretariat of the Protocol within the regular reporting cycles;
- (5) revising, if necessary, the set objectives in paragraph 1) of this Article;
- (6) establishing a way of monitoring the implementation of all other obligations of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of achieving the objective defined in Article 1 of the Protocol. In accordance with The Guidelines on Setting of Targets, Evaluation of Progress and Reporting the Working Group has been prepared *Baseline Analysis of the Situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina for the Implementation of the Protocol on Water and Health to the UN Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International*

*Lakes (hereinafter referred to as: "Baseline Analysis of Situation").* The purpose of the preparation of the Baseline Analysis of the Situation is to review current situation and availability of data in the areas which are subject to the Protocol. that relate to a specific, defined period. Targets under the Article 6 of the Protocol are an integral part of this document (Annex 1).

The Baseline Analysis of the Situation will be the basis for the preparation of the report on the implementation of the targets established in accordance with the Protocol, which is delivered to the UNECE Protocol on Water and Health Secretariat and the WHO Regional Office for Europe, every three years<sup>2</sup>.

**Targets set:**

In accordance with the Decision on Appointment of the Members of the Working Group on Monitoring the Implementation of Bosnia and Herzegovina's Obligations under the Protocol on Water and Health under the UN Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (Article 2), the objectives defined on behalf of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Republika Srpska, as well as the defined deadlines, are fully in accordance with the adopted laws and by-laws and strategic documents at the level of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Republika Srpska, the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Brčko District of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the other international legal acts, agreements and treaties acceded to by Bosnia and Herzegovina (Stabilization and Association Agreement, Agenda 2030 ...). Baseline Analysis of the Situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina for the Implementation of the Protocol on Water and Health to the UN Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes and targets for all level in BiH have been adopted at a session of the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina on 30 January 2020. Before that, the document was published on web platform of Council of Ministers of BiH for public consultations and all interested citizens and legal persons had an opportunity to directly participate in drafting of the Baseline Analysis.
