Why is drinking water supply still hazardous?

Lack of :

- Appropriate treatments
- Distribution systems
- Improved sanitation



- => solved through appropriate (waste) water treatments
- => resulting in safe drinking water

What are the hazards?

- Microbiological (pathogens)
- Contaminants (discharges, heavy metals, fertilisers,...)
- Treatments By-products (mainly from chloration)
 - => solved through appropriate (waste) water-treatments
 - => resulting in safe drinking water

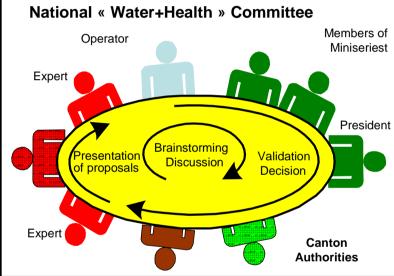
How to define targets?

 Build an interministerial committee with concerned stakeholders at national level

- 1) Presentation of the Protocol
- 2) Baseline analysis
- 3) Gap analysis and prioritization
- 4) Agreement of proposed targets,

target dates and relevant programme

- 5) Broad consultation
- 6) Publication of the targets and programme
- 7) Agreement of the results by the government



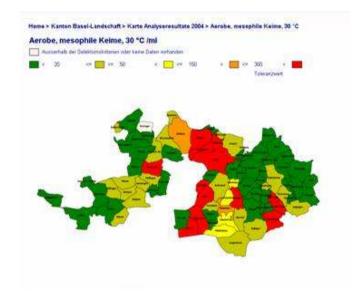
Promises have been made; how to measure the progresses?

Define mandatory indicators (and report on them!) for :

- Performance of drinking water distribution systems
- Performance of collecting waste water systems
- Drinking water quality (=> safe)
- Waste water quality (=> appropriate)
- Bathing water, acquaculture, ...

Parties have to report on the progresses made

- Summary reports (evaluation of existing datas)
- Published for
 - Partners
 - International organisations
 - Population
- Must contain an action plan for the future



Conclusions

• The challenge for the implementation at national level is:

- To manage a formal coordination between the stakeholders
- To mobilize people who have already their own goals defined
- To show the added value of the Protocol
 - Holistic approach
 - Sensitisation of the population
 - International support for national actions
