#### Basic dates (1)

- 1991 First special session of the UNECEWorking Party on Water Problems todraw up a framework convention
- 1992 Adoption of the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (Water Convention)
- 1996 Entry into force of the Water Convention (6 October)



Basic dates (2)

- 1997 First meeting of the Parties to the Water Convention (July 1997, Helsinki, Finland)
- 1999 Adoption of the Protocol on Water and Health to the 1992 Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (June 1999, London. Third Ministerial Conference on Environment and Health)



#### Basic dates (3)

2000 Second meeting of the Parties to the Convention (March 2000, The Hague, Netherlands)

2000 EC Water Framework Directive adopted by EU Member States (October 2000)



# Basic provisions of the Water Convention (I)


- Common research and development
- Exchange of information between Riparian Parties
- Warning and alarm systems (....> link to the Industrial Accidents convention
- Mutual assistance
- Public information



# Basic provisions of the Water Convention (II)

- Conclusion of bilateral and multilateral agreements
- Establishment of joint bodies
- Consultation between Riparian Parties
- Joint monitoring and assessment
