

## Guidance on Water Supply and Sanitation in Extreme Weather Events (GL WSS)

#### Why Climate Change in the Protocol

- Growing concern for Climate Change and Adverse meterological Events in the Region
- Huge vulnerability of water supply and – specially- sanitation in the Region and transboundary
- Adaptation measures are a chance to improve coping capacities, coop among sectors and between Countries, techn development and INVOLVEMENT of STAKEHOLDERS
- WSS are key health determinant and their risk management are generally not included in water management, although they may improve safe water availability
