

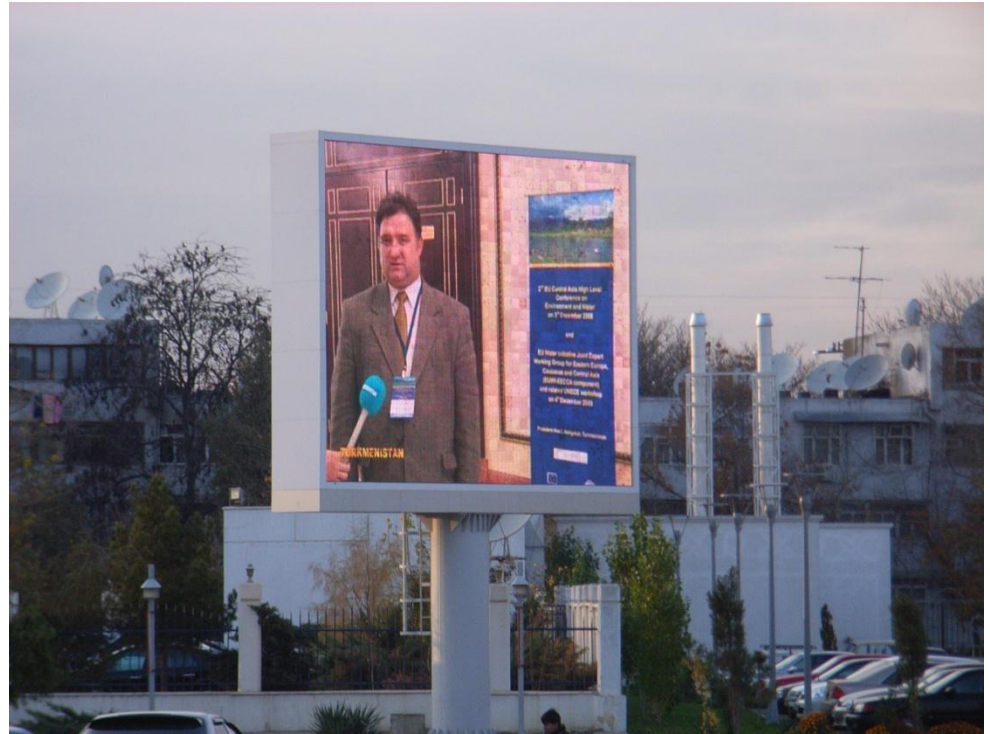

Background

- The Long and Winding Road...
 - progress monitoring reports have been prepared since 2005...
 - ... but impact monitoring reports have not, although an impact monitoring system has been discussed and agreed upon at several meetings of the Working Group (9th meeting in Helsinki in 2007, 10th meeting in Moscow in 2007, 11th meeting in Bucharest in 2008 and 12th meeting in Ashgabat in 2008)

- Objective is fairly straightforward
 - to monitor progress made within the EUWI-EECCA Component and actual impact on WSS and IWRM in the EECCA countries of various initiatives, including the EUWI-EECCA Component...
 - ... thereby providing the basis of an assessment of the extent to which objectives of the EUWI-EECCA Component are met

- Consolidated monitoring report will be prepared and presented at Multi Stakeholder Forum in Stockholm in August 2012, at latest



Structure and content of monitoring report

- 5 parts
 - Part 1: Key findings (Executive summary)
 - Part 2: Introduction, highlighting objectives of the EUWI-EECCA Component
 - Part 3: Progress monitoring
 - Part 4: Impact monitoring
 - Part 5: Detailed assessment of status and progress on water resources management
- Annexes providing references and data

Three types of data

- Progress monitoring data, including:
 - number of completed NPDs
 - number of ongoing NPDS
 - number of country dialogue meetings held
 - number of EU and non-EU countries outside the EECCA region providing co-financing to NPDs
 - key policy documents prepared

- Impact monitoring data, including:
 - water abstraction and consumption data
 - infrastructure data
 - tariffs
 - public budgets
 - loans and grants from donors and/or IFIs
 - pollution
 - legal and regulatory framework
 - memorandum items

- Water resources management data, including:
 - enabling conditions for water resources management (policies, agreements and legislation)
 - main elements of water resources management strategies, programmes and plans
 - implementation, monitoring and evaluation

Request

- Technical Secretariat, in cooperation with OECD and UNECE, may collect most of the data since public available data are to be used to the extent possible...
- ... but contribution from representatives of EECCA countries requested for, especially, water resources management data (questionnaire to be filled in)

- Hence, it is of utmost importance that the Technical Secretariat receives the name, position and coordinates of one contact person in each EECCA country
- **How to do this?**
