Draft Programme of Work of the Housing and Land Management Component of the Housing, Land Management and Population subprogramme for 2018-2019

Note by the Secretariat

Summary

This note contains a draft programme of work of the housing and land management component of the Housing, Land Management and Population subprogramme (“the subprogramme HLM component”) for 2018–2019.

The Committee on Housing and Land Management is invited to adopt it and recommend to the Executive Committee for approval

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I. Introduction

1. The present document sets out the draft programme of work of the Housing and Land Management Component of Housing, Land Management and Population subprogramme (“the subprogramme HLM component”) for 2018–2019. The Committee on Housing and Land Management is invited to adopt it and recommend to the Executive Committee for approval. Any subsequent additional, discontinued or carried over outputs will be reflected in the Integrated Monitoring and Document Information System used by the Secretariat for the planning, monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the programme. The results of the implementation of the programme of work will be submitted to the Committee in the Programme Performance report for the biennium 2018-2019.
2. The draft programme of work applies a results-based management approach, a broad management approach which establishes logical relationship between the hierarchical results (outputs – outcomes – impact) known as ‘results chain’, the resources (human and financial) known as ‘inputs’ and the external factors (strategic, governance, operational, financial) which can prevent from achieving the objective.
3. The outputs/activities in the draft programme of work correspond to those contained in the ECE proposed programme budget for 2018–2019. They fall into the following main categories: (a) meetings and related parliamentary documentation; (b) other substantive activities; and (c) technical cooperation, including advisory services, training courses, seminars, workshops, and field projects.
4. The outcomes/expected accomplishments, with corresponding indicators of achievement and performance measures are presented in Annex I in the form of a logical framework.
5. The details of the proposed publications are provided in Annex II. The overall ECE legislative mandates and those specific for the subprogramme HLM component are listed in Annex III.

II. Objective, strategy and external factors

6. The objective of the subprogramme HLM component is to improve housing, urban and land governance and to promote the evidence-based formulation of sustainable housing and land policies and their implementation in the region.
7. The responsibility for the housing and land management component of the subprogramme is vested in the Forests, Land and Housing Division.
8. The objective of the HLM component subprogramme will be achieved through: (a) international policy dialogue on housing, urban development and land administration; (b) normative work on affordable and energy efficient housing, urban planning and development and land administration; and (c) capacity building and sharing of best practices and lessons learned in all the areas of the subprogramme's housing and land management component work.
9. The HLM component of the subprogramme will contribute to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the achievement of the housing, urban and land-related Sustainable Development Goals, especially Goal 11, but in addition due to its cross-cutting nature, Goals 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 12. Due consideration will be given to the integration of climate change measures into

national policies, strategies and planning in the area of housing and land management. The HLM component of the subprogramme will establish synergies in the respective areas of work with ECE subprogrammes: (1) Environment, (2) Transport, (3) Statistics, (4) Economic Cooperation and Integration, (5) Sustainable Energy, and (7) Timber and Forestry.

10. The HLM component works to improve housing, urban development and land administration and management. It supports the implementation of the New Urban Agenda¹, Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing (E/ECE/1478/Rev.1)² and Strategy for Sustainable Housing and Land Management in the ECE region for the period 2014-2020 (ECE/HBP/2013/3)³

11 To promote sustainable housing and real estate markets, the HLM component of the subprogramme will support the governments in improving energy efficiency in buildings, facilitating the maintenance, management and refurbishment of existing housing stock and developing real estate markets which contribute to economic growth. It will focus on the social dimensions of sustainable housing to address housing affordability, adaptation of the housing stock to demographic changes, such as ageing of the population, and access to healthy and safe housing (E/ECE/1478/Rev.1). The will also cover monitoring of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda, the Geneva UN Charter on Sustainable Housing and the Strategy for Sustainable Housing and Land Management in the ECE region for the period 2014-2020.

12. To support sustainable urban development, the HLM component of the subprogramme will promote an integrated approach to planning of cities and human settlements. The focus will be on activities relevant to spatial planning which will result in compact, efficient and inclusive cities, low-carbon and disaster resilient urban development and addressing challenges of informal settlements. The will also support the implementation of the ECE smart city indicators and preparation of smart sustainable city profiles.

13. To assist member States to improve land administration and land management, the HLM component of the subprogramme will promote security of tenure; improvement of cadastres and land registries, including institutional arrangements for land administration. This cluster will address land registration, e-governance, land tenure, spatial information and cadastres. An emphasis will be placed on issues of innovation and capacity building in land administration.

14. Country profiles on housing and land management, which assess the housing, urban development and land sectors, will be conducted upon the request of member States. These studies will be coordinated by the secretariat and drafted by independent international experts in cooperation with national experts. Work on the country profiles will also include monitoring of, and support to, the implementation of the country profiles' recommendations, including through the preparation of national action plans on sustainable housing and urban development and model projects.

15. The HLM component of the subprogramme is expected to achieve its objective and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) there are adequate national statistical data and information available on housing, urban

development and land management; (b) there is political will, an adequate legislative and regulatory framework, adequate institutions and sufficient resources to allow member States to implement the recommendations of the Committee on Housing and Land Management; and (c) there is donor's support for the preparation of studies and guidelines and undertaking of country and city profile studies is adequate.
