Second Meeting of the Team of Specialists on Entrepreneurship in Poverty Alleviation

Geneva, Switzerland, 29 August 2002

Note by the secretariat

Introduction

At its first session held on 11 February 2002, the Team of Specialists on Entrepreneurship in Poverty Alleviation, Working Party on Industry and Enterprise Development, discussed a draft of work plan, proposed by the UNECE secretariat, and approved a biennium plan of work of 2002-2004 (TRADE/WP.8/2002/11).

Activities of the Team of Specialists on Entrepreneurship in Poverty Alleviation in 2002-2004

It was decided that the Team of Specialists would focus on youth unemployment and poverty in order to identify youth-specific factors that have been impeding the entry of young adults to labour markets and the emerging private sector in select countries in transition. It would also consider youth programmes and projects, including programmes, promoting youth entrepreneurial activities, in ECE member States that were successful in alleviating youth unemployment and poverty. On the basis of the above, the Team of Specialists expects to be able to identify best youth entrepreneurship policies and models and to produce guidelines and tool kits that could be applied by governmental and non-governmental organizations of the ECE member States, experiencing large-scale social and economic marginalization of young adults.

As the first step in implementing its plan of work the Team of Specialists decided to prepare a questionnaire to be sent to countries in transition in order to have a clear picture of on-going activities relevant to the mission of the TOS.

The TOS also decided to hold the First Regional Forum on Youth during the year 2002. It approved the provisional agenda of the Forum submitted by the UNECE secretariat. The results of the Forum will be discussed at the second session of the TOS, for which the date will be established through consultations with the TOS members.

The TOS intends to seek contribution from national experts and government agencies actively involved in promoting youth entrepreneurial activities. Efforts will be undertaken to mobilize extra budgetary resources/voluntary contributions to finance country missions and consultancy.

Implementation Activities

The TOS has prepared the questionnaire, which was sent to countries in transition by the Coordinating Unit for ECE Operational Activities (CUOA) on 26 April 2002 (see the attachment 1). The responses are expected being received in the fall of 2002.

The preparation process for the Regional Forum on Youth was launched in March 2002. UNECE member countries and UN agencies were invited to join the Commission in this effort. International Labour Office, United Nations International Children's Fund, United Nations High Commissioner on Human Rights, United Nations Joint Programme on HIV/AIDS and Department of Economic and Social Affairs agreed to sponsor the event. I was also agreed that all the organizational work and most of the substantive documents would be carried out by the UNECE, while the UN agencies-partners will contribute with their resource people.

In the process of the preparation of the above Forum, UNECE prepared 4 documents and a Forum programme. A Youth Forum website was set up for the purpose of mobilizing a wider support for the event and its goals. Apart from the major event, the Contest of Young Artists was launched to stimulate the interest of youth in possibilities of new technologies in terms of career option. Participating youth organizations were offered an opportunity to present their project proposals for the donor community at the Round Table with ICT companies.

The Agenda of the Session of the TOS

It is proposed, that during its second session the members of the TOS will focus on the following issues:

- 1. The Outcome of the First Forum on Youth.
- 2. The follow-up to the Forum.
- 3. Preparation of the Forum proceedings.
- 4. Consideration of possible pilot project-proposals.
- 5. Fund-raising

- 3. We expect that there will be differences in definitions of terms and groups between the countries. In order to enable us to bring it to the same basis and to be as accurate as possible, please make a appropriate remark or attach the definition of the various terms in your country.
