Why Open Standards

What is an Open Standard?

- Just anything a single vendor declares is a standard? Or anything on which two or more vendors agree?
 - ◆ These may be "specifications" or "de facto standards", but not "open standards" from the OASIS point of view
- Open Standards are specifications developed and/or approved under a
 - Published, consistent process
 - Fair environment
 - Transparent, open operations
 - Transparent output

What is an Open Standard?

An open standard is:

- publicly available in stable, persistent versions
- developed and approved under a published process
- open to public input: public comments, public archives, no NDAs
- subject to explicit, disclosed IPR terms
- See the US, EU, WTO governmental & treaty definitions of "standards"
