UNECE

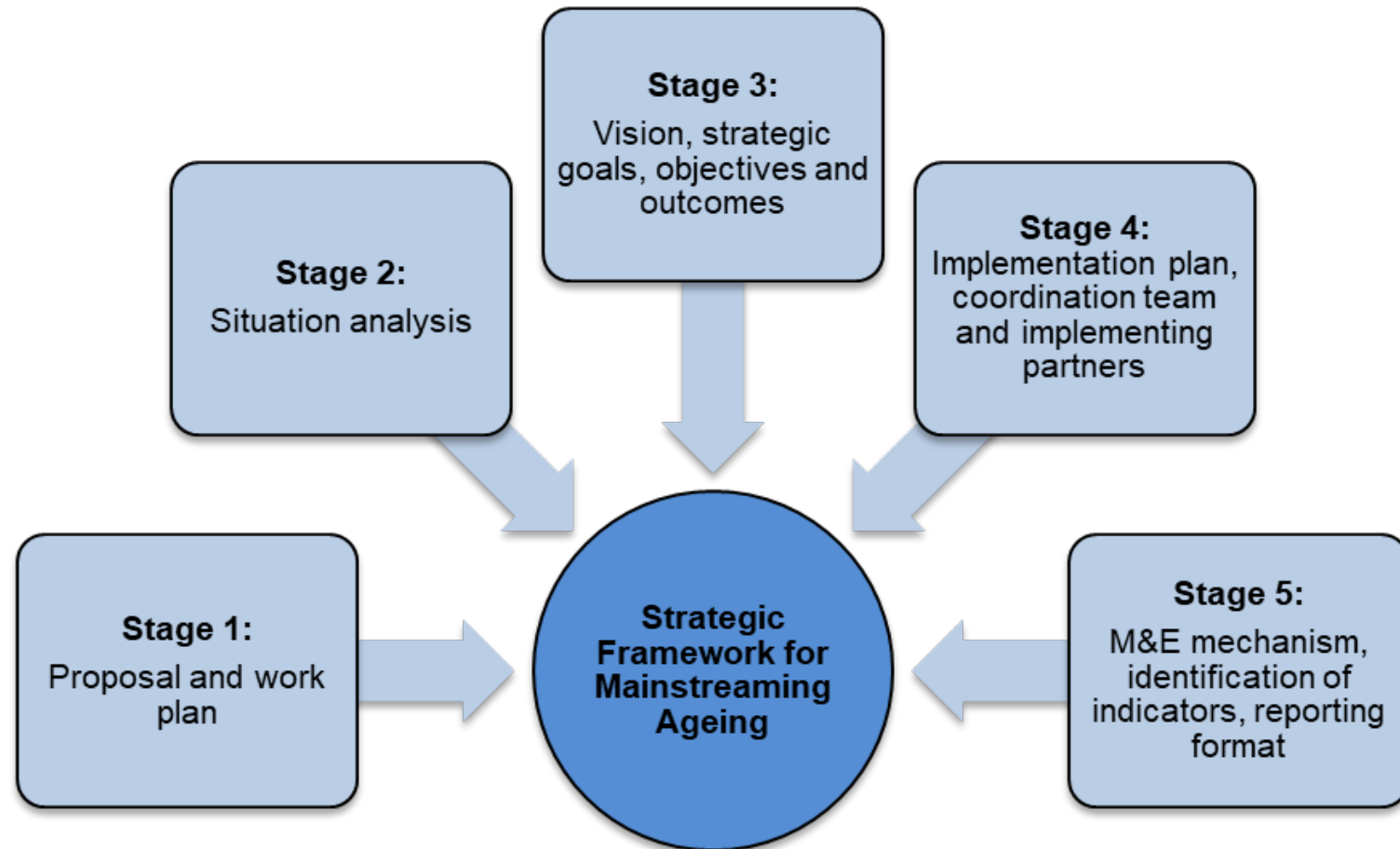
- Address both the **societal and individual implications** of population ageing
- Recognize the **heterogeneity and diversity** of older persons
- Apply a **life-course approach** and foster **inter-generational solidarity and equity**
- Be **human rights-based**
- **Align with relevant international frameworks** (MIPAA, 2030 Agenda, Decade of Healthy Ageing, Human Rights Conventions)
- **Holistic and systematic**
- **Adaptable and accessible**
- **Outcome-oriented and evidence-based**
- **Promote efficiencies and offer practical approaches**

The **purpose** of the guidelines is **to support governments in building a strategic framework for mainstreaming ageing** to facilitate the systematic consideration and integration of both individual and population ageing aspects into broader national policies.

A twin-track approach to Mainstreaming Ageing



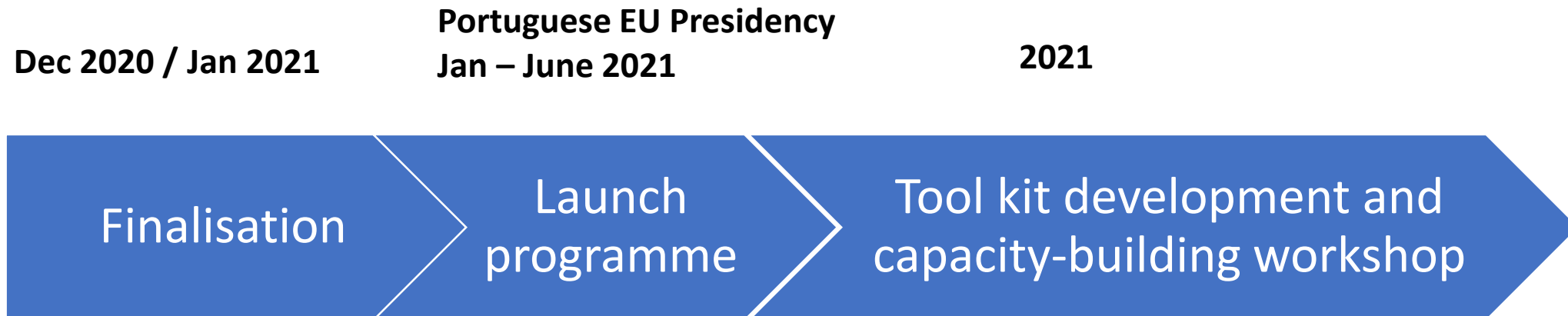
Strategic Framework for Mainstreaming Ageing

- Commence development of a tool kit and organise of a first capacity-building workshop

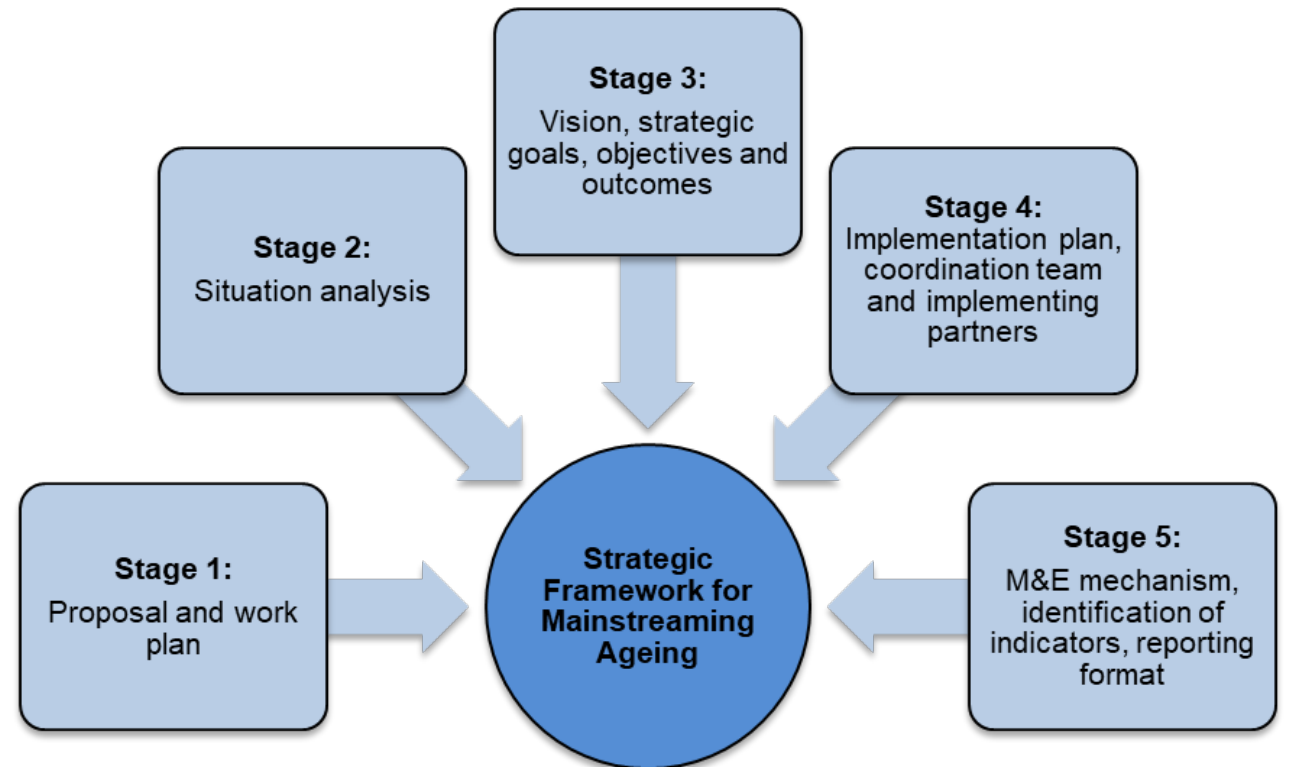


Tool kit and capacity-building
