Stratified Random Sample, 2011 Population Register

- Sex
- Age (18-49/50-79)
- Metro/non-metro
 - Stockholm, Gothenburg, Malmö vs. the rest

N = 18,000

Data collection

- Telephone Interview & Registers
 - Family of origin, current partner, children
 - Partner history
 - Fertility intentions
 - Education, employment, occupation & income (respondent and current partner)
- Postal Questionnaire
 - Household economy, household work, decision-making
 - Social and economic exchange
 - Health and well-being
 - Values, beliefs, subjective norms, intentions

Response

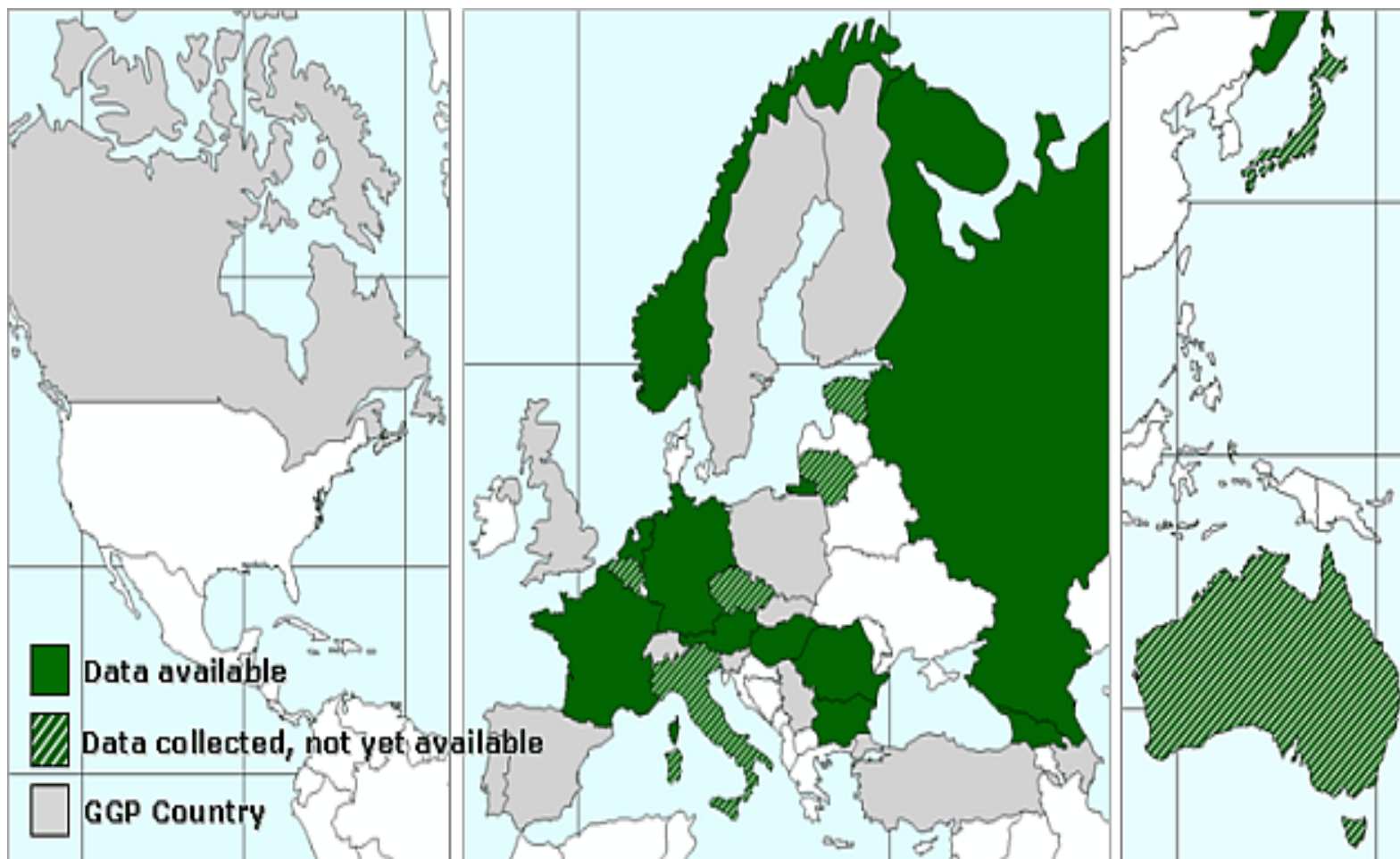

Current production

- Statistics Sweden
 - Register data matching
 - Non-response analysis
- SUDA/SPaDE
 - Documentation
 - Quex translations expected December
 - Codebook with frequencies early 2014
 - Data for harmonization June 2014

Distribution & access

- SUDA/SPaDE , Aging Research Center, Karolinska Institute)
 - Complete data via Statistics Sweden’s Microdata Online Access (MONA) system
- Swedish National Data Service
 - Excludes “personal” information (health, fecundity and following filtered questions, parental leave, sick leave)
- GGP (NIDI/INED)
 - SND version plus respondent’s (but not partner’s) “personal” information

“Waves” 2 and 3

- Educational history from 1985
- Income (employment) history from 1981
- Migration history from 1968
- Follow-up
 - Educational enrollment and attainment
 - Income (employment): R & P until separate
 - Family events: Separation/divorce, marriage, births (same/different partner)
- Attrition: NONE!
