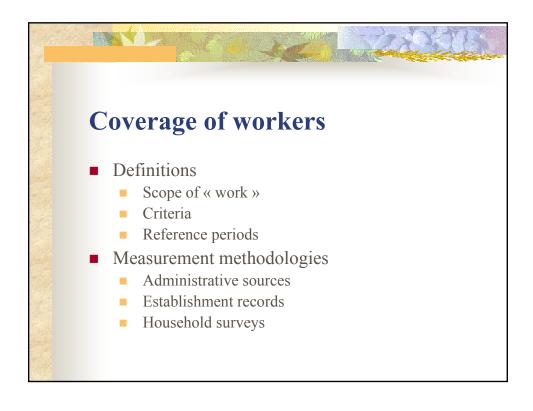
Conventional labour statistics

- These affect mostly women but also men
- Inadequate policies and programmes
- Ineffective in reducing inequality
