Characteristics of good labour statistics

- Coverage
 - Of relevant topics
 - Of workers and work situations
- Detail
- Presentation



Conventional labour statistics

- Do not describe well or ignore relevant topics and/or non-core workers and work situations
- These affect mostly women but also men
- Inadequate policies and programmes
- Ineffective in reducing inequality



Solution

- Political will at all levels
- Awareness at all levels
- Gender team



Coverage of topics

- Conventional topics

AND

- New topics:
 - Unpaid work
 - Atypical forms of employment
 - Working time arrangements
 - Existence of care facilities
 - Control of productive resources
 - Allocation of benefits
 - Attitudes and opinions
