Provisional agenda and tentative timetable

The Work Session will start at 9:30 on Monday 28 April in the Palais des Nations, **Salle IX**, 3rd floor (see attached map). The meeting is expected to end in the early part of the afternoon of Wednesday 30 April. If there is time permitting, immediately after the meeting (e.g., possibly from 15:30-17:00), there will be a **side meeting** organised by UNSD in cooperation with ECE and Eurostat.

The main purpose of the side meeting is to introduce participants to the UN recommendations on Statistics of International Migration, explain the proposed format and content of the joint questionnaire and possible revisions to it, and elicit feedback from participants on their experience in compiling international migration statistics. The side meeting is mainly targeted to statisticians from Eastern European countries, EU Candidate/Applicant countries and countries from other developing regions who will be attending the work session. However, all participants in the work session are invited to participate in the side meeting.

Participants are kindly requested to pick up their conference accreditation cards (badges) at the Security Identification Office, Villa les Feuillantines, 13 Avenue de la Paix, opposite the main entrance of the Palais des Nations (see attached map). The office is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Participants should note that the formalities for the issuance of badges might take a long time. Therefore, they are encouraged to go to the Security Identification Office early, in order to obtain the badge on time to reach the conference room before the meeting starts.

After having obtained the badge, participants can enter the UN premises through two gates: the pedestrian passage at Place des Nations (buses 5, 8, 11, 14 and 18: stop Nations) and the Pregny Gate (Avenue de la Paix, 14; buses 8 and 18: stop Appia).
