COUNTRIES' PLANS FOR THE 2010 CENSUSES: RESULTS OF THE ECE QUESTIONNAIRE

Housing

1. Table 15 shows that the core questions on **number of occupants**, **number of rooms** and **type of ownership** are to be included by almost all countries that responded to the questionnaire.

In contrast, the questions relating to the availability of household amenities, such as **bathing** and **toilet facilities**, the **water supply system** and **kitchens** are not being considered by a significant proportion of countries (just over a quarter). For a number of these (such as Australia, Canada, Netherlands, Sweden, the US and the UK for example) availability of such amenities is seen as providing an increasingly less effective indicator of poor housing conditions. However, only half of these countries are also considering omitting the core question on **type of heating**, which may be regarded as a more discriminating variable.

3. A seemingly anomalous result of the survey is the apparent intention of seven of the responding countries not to collect information relating to the **location of living quarters**. However, in the light of the fact that all these countries report that they intend to collect information on **place of usual residence** in their population censuses we conclude that this is more likely to be the result of a misunderstanding of either the questionnaire or the 2000 Recommendations themselves.

4. Among the non-core questions relating to housing units and living quarters shown in Table 16 there is a fairly marked gradation from high compliance with the question on **useful and/or living floor space**, for which a rather surprisingly high number of countries (some 26 in all) report they propose adopting the 2000 Recommendations, to relatively low compliance with the questions on household amenities such as telephone, cooking facilities and consumer goods, none of which will be asked by more than half the responding countries in their 2010 round of censuses.

5. Whereas a question on the availability of **piped gas** is to be included in one form or other by almost two thirds of the responding countries, a similar question on the availability of **electricity** will only be included by 18 countries.

6. As with the core questions on **bathing** and **toilet facilities** and **kitchens**, many countries will regard information on access to a **car**, a **telephone** and **cooking facilities** as increasingly less valuable as a measure of poor housing conditions. But it is surprising perhaps, in view if its possible use as measures of social disadvantage and dependency on public transport, that only 15 countries, seemingly, are planning to include a question on the **number of cars available to the household**. Many of the countries that do not plan for such a question, but not all, however, are Eastern European or former Soviet states where general levels of car ownership may be expected to be significantly lower than the average throughout the ECE region.

7. Table 17 shows that the core questions on **period of construction** and **type of building** are being included in the next round of censuses by most countries that responded to the questionnaire, and that the 2000 Recommendations will be followed in most cases.

8. However, some responses to the non-core questions relating to buildings suggest that the guidance offered by the current Recommendations may not be entirely clear in every case. Responses suggest, for example, that some countries have interpreted the question on **number of floors** as relating to the *dwelling* rather than the *building* of which the dwelling is part. Also the question on **number of dwellings in the building** is seemingly being included by some countries (such as France and Romania) that have not reported including questions on buildings in the next round of censuses.

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9. We note that the current Recommendations offer no guidance at all in respect of the question on state of repair nor the question on **whether the building is a farm building or not**. However, in the case of the latter question, less than a half of responding countries see a need to collect specific information that distinguishes between **farm and non-farm buildings**. Not surprisingly, all are countries where there is a heavy economic dependence on agricultural industry - Canada and Sweden being the only ones that are not eastern European or former Soviet states.

10. Only three countries (Canada, Finland and Switzerland) report that they plan to include a question on **state of repair of building** in the 2010 round.
