In-depth reviews carried out by the CES Bureau



- **International migration and cross-border mobility** (based on paper by Mexico); outcome:
 - Proposal to set up a Task Force on the use of new data sources for measuring international migration and cross-border mobility
- **Measuring well-being in the era of "digital society"** (based on paper by Canada); outcome:
 - A number of potential issues for further work identified, Canada to prepare a concrete proposal for the next CES Bureau meeting
 - Measuring digital transformation discussed at CES plenary under item 3
- **The role of the statistical community in climate action** (based on a paper by the Steering Group on climate change-related statistics (Chair: Luxembourg)); outcome:
 - Overview of activities of international organizations in this area available in the updated paper for CES (ECE/CES/2020/21)
 - The paper to be widely circulated, including outside the statistical community
 - SG will prepare a proposal for concrete further actions for CES Bureau October 2020 meeting
- **The papers have been sent out for comments in an electronic consultation. Invite Conference to endorse the outcomes.**
