Main goals for 2002/2007

Discussed by UN Statistical Commission 1999

Consider larger framework of classifications
 Convergence

 For activity and product classifications

 Address economic changes

 New activities and products
 New concepts?

 Engage all countries

Schedule for 2002/2007

- Convergence requires extensive research and discussions
- Pressing need to address several issues
- Consideration of concepts requires time
- Two full-scale revisions in 5-year time frame not possible

Solution:

- Address some needs in a limited update, leaving structure intact (2002)
- (Possible) full-scale revision in 2007

Update supplementary texts (introduction)
 Reflect major changes in economy

 Limit impact on structure
 No new concepts
 Use alternate aggregations
 Chapter review of CPC

ISIC / CPC 2002 reputation

Introduction
 Chapter on statistical units
 Examples for coding
 Coding guidelines
 General review

Explanatory notes

- More line items, more examples
- Division and group notes
- Style change

Common language = small step towards convergence

Alternate aggregations
 Dropped: Tourism (replaced by TSA)
 New: Information Sector (NAICS)
 New: ICT Sector (OECD)
 New: Informal sector aggregates

Structure

- Added: Division 96, 97
 - Undifferentiated goods / services producing activities of private households
 Touches SNA boundaries
 - Uses: Labour force surveys, household statistics

Based on frequent country requests
Individual economies will still need more detail (e.g. PICs)

Structure

- Split: Group 5150 (Wholesale of other machinery)
 New classes:
 - 5151 Wholesale of computers, computer peripheral equipment and software
 - 5152 Wholesale of electronic and telecommunications parts and equipment
 - 5159 Wholesale of other machinery, equipment and supplies

 Based on requests by countries and the WPIIS; necessary to identify ICT Sector

Structure

 Split: Group 7220 (Software consultancy and supply)
 New classes:

 7221 Software publishing
 7229 Other software consultancy

 Based on country requests; necessary to identify Information Sector

Class definitions
 Change: Education (Section M)
 Aligned with ISCED-97

Clarification: On-line publishing etc. (class 7240)
 Aligned with previous rulings

Smaller corrections

Is ISIC Rev.3.1 compatible to Rev.3?

Structure has only changed for divisions or groups that were not subdivided before

 New structure allows countries to identify detail in a standardized way

Aggregates are compatible

What has changed in CPC?

Introduction - Regular update Goods part (Section 0-4) Recognized changes in Harmonized System (HS) 2002 Mostly updates of HS links only Few adjustments in subclass scope One creation of a new group One deletion of a subclass

What has changed in CPC?

Services part (Section 5-9)

- Assets new group 733, deletion of divisions 51-53
- Revision of Division 84 (Telecommunications services)

 Revision of Division 86 (Services on a fee or contract basis)

What has changed in CPC?

Smaller structural changes

- Mixed mode transport 6411
- Real estate appraisal 7224
- Advertising services 8363

Small corrections in subclass scope
 Adjustments to explanatory notes

Is CPC Ver.1.1 compatible to Ver.1.0?

- Structure in divisions 84, 86, 87 has changed considerably
 - 84 provides more detail
 - 86-89 mostly renumbered
 - Correspondece tables are provided
- Changes in section 5 and group 733 affect the scope of CPC
 - Future asset classification and SNA review of treatment of intangible assets will provide further guidance

What are the next steps?

Prepare for revision in 2007
 – Evaluation of recent changes
 – Sector review for CPC
 – Evaluation of country needs and convergence requirements for ISIC
 – Relationships to other classifications

The process – ISIC 2007

Discussion papers on:

- Conceptual issues
- ISIC structure draft (top levels)
- Coding options
- Questionnaires sent to countries in 2001 and 2003
- Review of convergence work
- Full structure draft (distributed in May 2004)
- Plan: Final structure to be submitted to Statistical Commission in March 2006

Revisions are part of larger frame of work on SNA and BOP revisions

The process – CPC 2007

Discussion papers on:

- Conceptual issues
- Specific proposals
- Questionnaires sent to countries in 2001 and 2003 (part of ISIC questionnaire)
- Explicit request for proposals and comments (distributed in July 2004)
- Plan: Final structure to be submitted to Statistical Commission in March 2006
- Revisions are part of larger frame of work on SNA and BOP revisions

- What is their place in the System of National Accounts?
- What are other uses of these classifications?

Conceptual issues

Larger framework and scope

- Legal entities (e.g. funds) that exceed current ISIC boundaries
- Coherent framework for ISIC and CPC
 CPC measuring output of ISIC categories
- Unifying principle

Other applications

– Can it reflect tourism, environment etc.?

Activity-product link

- Industry of origin
- Treatment of vertical integration
- What industry distinctions are observable in trade classifications?
- How useful is HS for defining product categories?

Extension of top structure reflects
Relevance enhancements
Adoption of new concepts
Recognition of major services areas

Stability/continuity for many areas remains priority – Raised by large group of ISIC users
