Profiling

- LCU population:
 - Active Profiling; action when needed based on:
 - Sources
 - Contacts
 - Internet/newspapers
 - Consistency problems T-1
 - Maintenance rather than new profiles
 - Information to other departments by profile reports

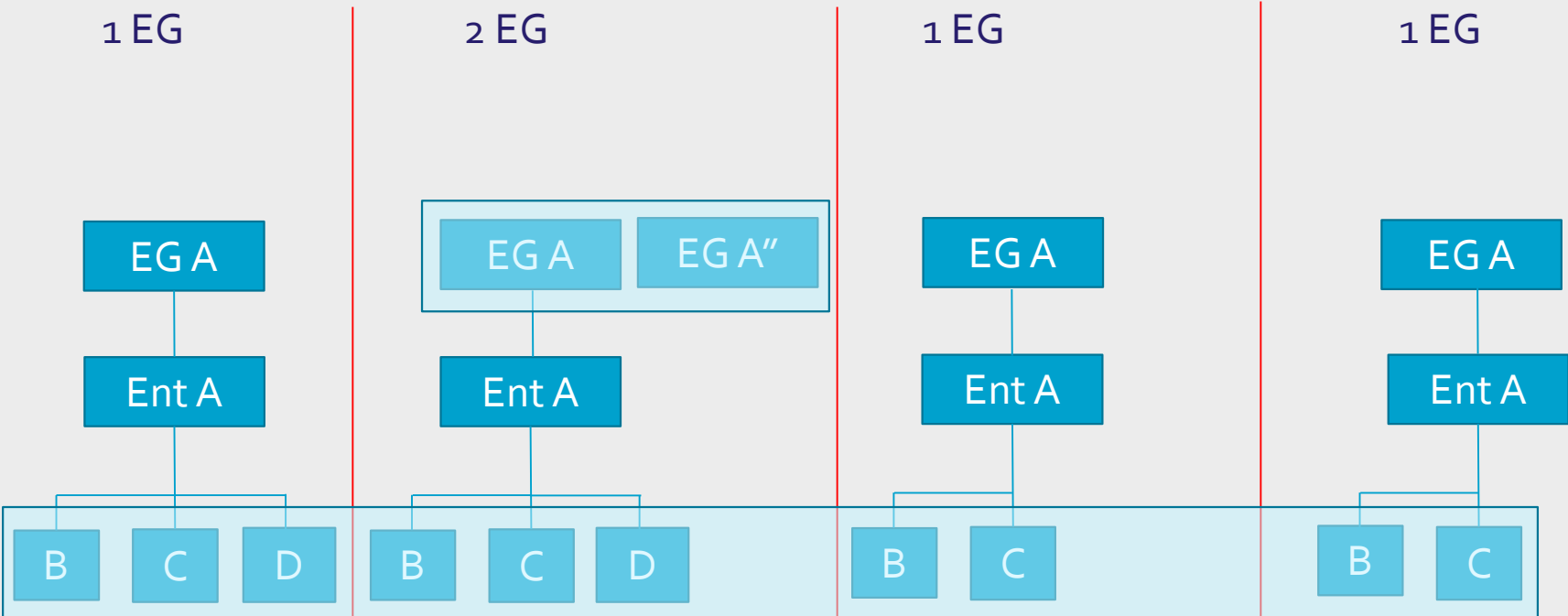

Conclusions

- Data collection is prepared in time by special “Collection agreement”
- LEU “D” is not in the final frame of year 2019
- Due to special “Collection agreement” the respondent knows how to fill in the data
