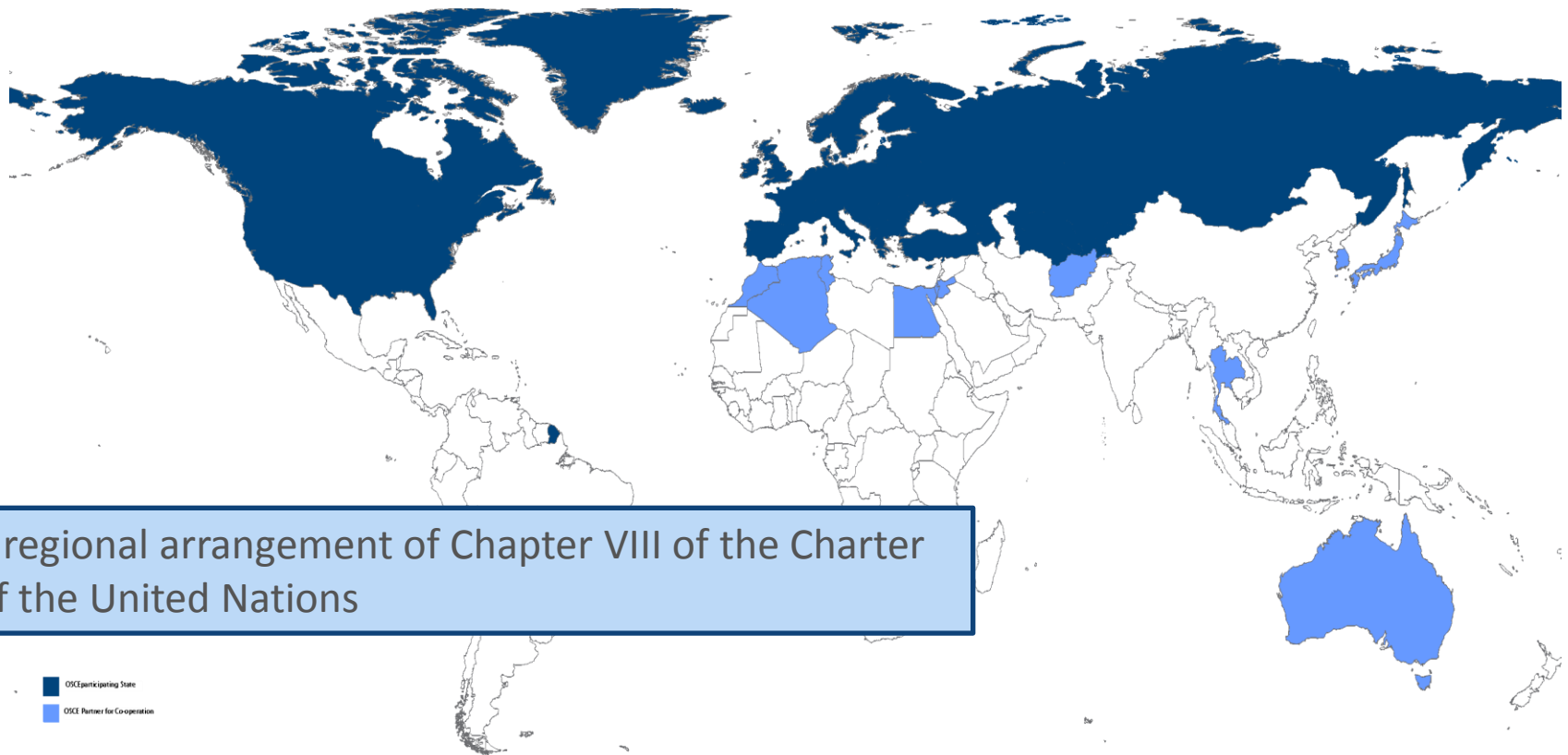

Project Rationale

- OSCE commitments and mandate
- Worldwide lack of comparable data – FRA survey covers now 28 EU Member States/ OSCE participating States (pS)
- OSCE adds up to 8 (pS)s = 36 OSCE pS covered
- **Conflict perspective** – first time the topic is covered to this extent (in particular in the regions covered)

Key Objectives


- ✓ To generate comprehensive and comparable data on prevalence rates of VAW in the study regions
- ✓ To provide analysis of the results which help to understand how conflict affects VAW
- ✓ To generate a baseline for future analysis;
- ✓ To generate deeper understanding of VAW/VAW related to conflict, also through qualitative research
- **Ultimately: Improved policy and programming at a national and international level**

Design, pre test and pilot of survey
and preliminary qualitative research
+ consultations (2017)



Fieldwork (first half of 2018)
Analysis, report drafting, translation
(second half 2018)



Dissemination campaign
(early 2019)

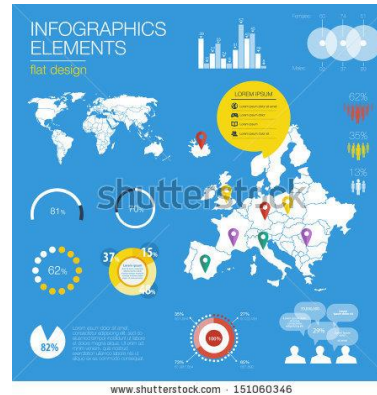
Comparability plus contextualization

- Same approach to sampling (representative sample of women aged 18-74 representativeness achieved through two stage random probability sampling)
- Same questionnaire
- Everywhere face-to face CAPI interviewing

- ❖ Expanded section on gender norms & attitudes and
- ❖ Norms & attitudes on disclosure
- ❖ Qualitative research

Results and products

- 1) Multi-country report
- 2) Thematic reports



Media attention and public debate

- 3) Policy briefs – focus on recommendations
+ Data summaries and full data sets for national stakeholders
+ background profiles



Data can be used for:

- CEDAW - Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women
 - Women peace and security
 - The Sustainable Development Goals 5.2 and marginally 16 indicators
 - 5.2.1 and 5.2.2
- If applicable:*
- Istanbul Convention
 - Article 11 – Data collection and research: statistical data, surveys on prevalence rates of 1) physical, (2) sexual & (3) psychological violence
 - Monitoring by GREVIO (Art 66)
 - Gender Equality Index by EU used by some EU accession countries

Use of OSCE data for SDG indicators

- Active outreach of project to Statistical Offices (Focal points)
- Results will be in line with SDG indicators and disaggregation possible
- Sharing of tools and results:
 - Micro-data
 - Translations of questionnaire
 - Analysis of main trends/findings at national level
