Gender Statistics in Georgia



- Since 1999, 11 publications - "Women and Men in Georgia" - have been published.
- In 2011, the new product – Gender Statistics – was introduced on Geostat web site.
- In 2013, data on gender statistics was placed in databases.
- In 2018, Geostat launched a portal of Gender Statistics.
- In 2019, SDG application was added on Gender Statistics Portal.
- In 2020, MICS Indicators were added on Gender Statistics Portal.

Gender Statistics in Georgia



Geostat has implemented several successful projects in cooperation with EU, UN/UN Women for improving gender statistics:

- Supporting National Statistical office of Georgia to produce more and better-quality data and analysis for tracking gender equality and women's empowerment, 2020-2022
- Unite to Fight Violence against Women, 2018-2019
- National Study on Violence Against Women, 2017
- Strengthening National Statistical System, 2013
- To Enhance Gender Equality in Georgia - Gender Sensitive Statistics 2000-2013 (UN Joint Programme)

 - ✓ Support analysis and explanation of data
 - ✓ Make more microdata available and support its use
 - ✓ Support decision-makers to access and apply statistics
5. Work in partnership
