Introduction

Statistical Capacity Development

process through which NSOs and NSS strengthen and maintain the capabilities to set, achieve and reinforce their institutional framework as well as their capacity to develop, produce and disseminate statistics over time → SDGs and beyond



Investing in National Statistical System and National Statistical Office (coordination role)

Modernisation, Innovation

Increasing demand of soft skills

→ institutional, planning, communication, users, etc.



Country-driven

Identification of needs and priorities

Resources available



Partnership and cooperation

Long term project → tailored capacity support with a country-led focus

Coordination of initiatives (mapping who is doing what and where ...and how)

Sharing good practices → country to countries but also across countries
