Insufficient coverage of the data (are all sectors of economic activities covered, are all municipalities covered); timeliness of the data. ▪ <u>Validation of data</u>: How is data validation implemented, including validation against other sources (e.g. custom data on hazardous waste)? ▪ <u>Methodologies</u>: Inconsistencies in methodologies and how to cope with them, e.g. measurement units, estimations, etc?
