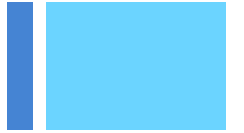

 - After workshop: consolidate data in the UNU Tools
- Core statistics are needed for the Regional E-waste Monitor
- UNU presented models to transfer core statistics into environmental impact
- Group sessions were held to gather info + write down the other needed information
- After workshop → UNU offered follow-up support to requesting countries
