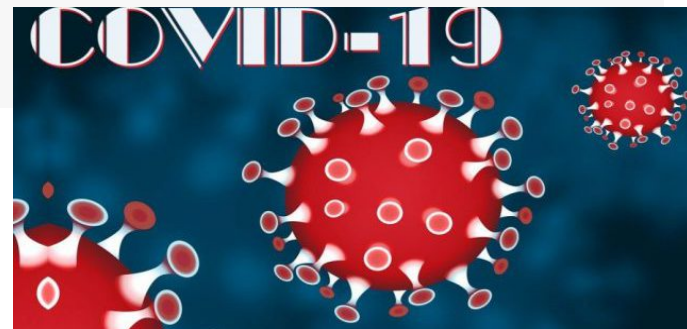
The Crisis

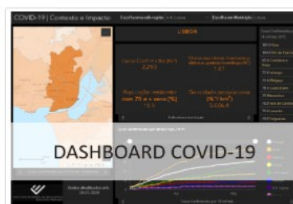

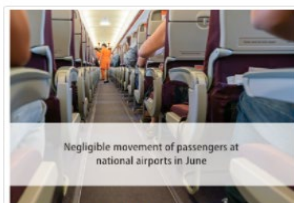

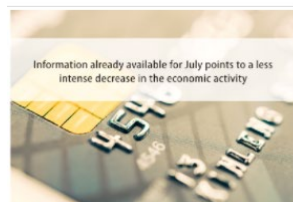

Context indicators for the COVID-19 pandemic in Portugal



Demographic and territorial context indicators

Number of deaths between March 1st and June 21st, 2020 higher than in the same period in 2019 and 2018

The preliminary total number of deaths between March 1st (the first cases of COVID-19 were registered on March 2) the first death on March 16) and June 21st 2020 was 2,745 higher than the number registered in the same period 2019 and 1,206 cases higher than number of deaths registered in 2018. The positive variation in relation to 2019 is due mainly to the increase in the number of deaths of people aged 75 and over (+ 2,509).

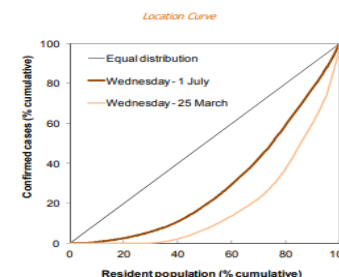
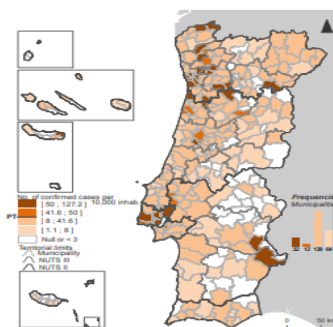

Figures 2 and 3 allow the comparison of the cumulative number of deaths from March to June 21st 2020 with 1 observed in the same period in 2019 and 2018. The total number of deaths registered in 2020 surpassed that registered in 2018 and 2019 on March 20th and 30th, respectively, identified by the time lines inserted in the figure. Regarding deaths of people aged 75 and over these dates were March 19th and 30th, respectively.

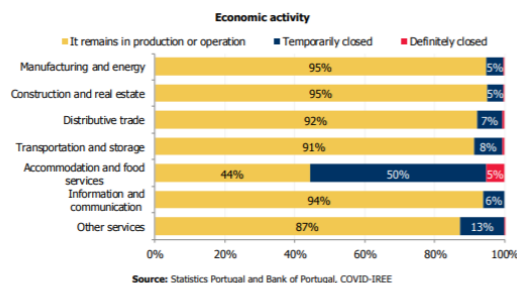
32 municipalities registered both a number of confirmed cases per 10 thousand inhabitants and population density values above the national reference

The following figure illustrates the relationship between population density and the number of confirmed cases per 10 thousand inhabitants. Of the 44 municipalities with a number of confirmed cases per 10 thousand inhabitants above the value for Portugal, 32 also had population density values above the national average. From this set of 32 municipalities, the municipalities of Ovar (127.2), in Região de Aveiro; Condeixa-a-Nova (87.4) in Região de Coimbra; Amadora (94.5), Loures (87.6), Odivelas (70.5), Sintra (70.3) and Lisboa (70.1), in the Metropolitan Area of Lisboa; Valongo (78.3), Matosinhos (73.7), Vale de Cambra (72.7), Maia (68.4), Gondomar (65.8) and Porto (65.3), in the Metropolitan Area of Porto; Felgueiras (74.4) and Lousada (74.2) in Tâmega e Sousa; Braga (68.8) in Cávado; and Vizela (63.2) in the sub-region of Ave, stood out with more than 60 confirmed cases per 10 thousand inhabitants. It should also be noted that 184 of the 308 municipalities in the country had a number of confirmed cases per 10 thousand inhabitants and population density below the national reference.

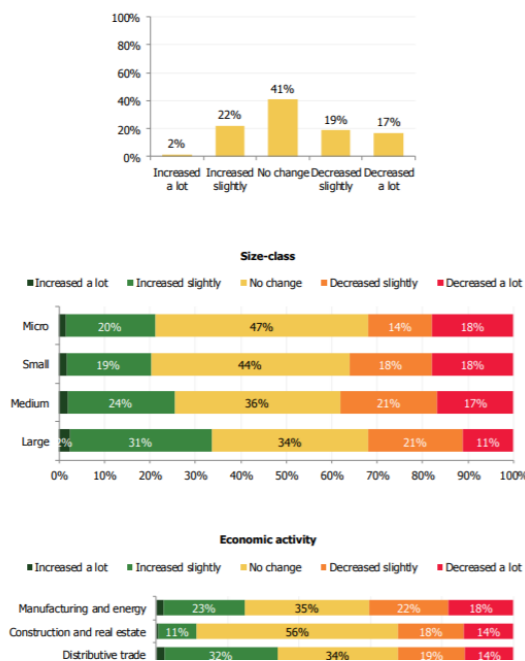
Impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on turnover in the first fortnight of May 2020, compared to the expected situation without the pandemic

77% of the enterprises continued to register a decrease in turnover due to the pandemic

- Regarding the expected situation without pandemic, 77% of the enterprises in operation or temporarily closed continue to report a negative impact on turnover. Of the remaining enterprises, 4% had a positive impact and 19% no impact.
- The *Accommodation and food services* and *Transportation and storage* sectors stand out with a higher percentage of enterprises reporting reductions in turnover (97% and 86%, respectively). In contrast, the *Construction and real estate* sector recorded the lowest percentage of enterprises with a reduction in turnover (63%).
- 35% of the enterprises reported a reduction of more than 50% in turnover in the first half of May (slightly lower percentage than in the previous fortnight).

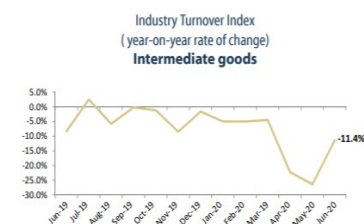
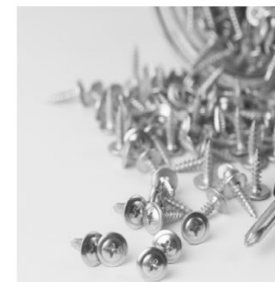
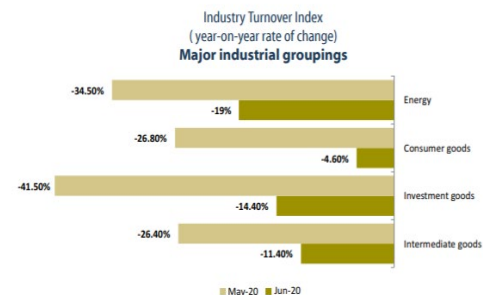

- Tourism activity – June 2020, published on August 14.



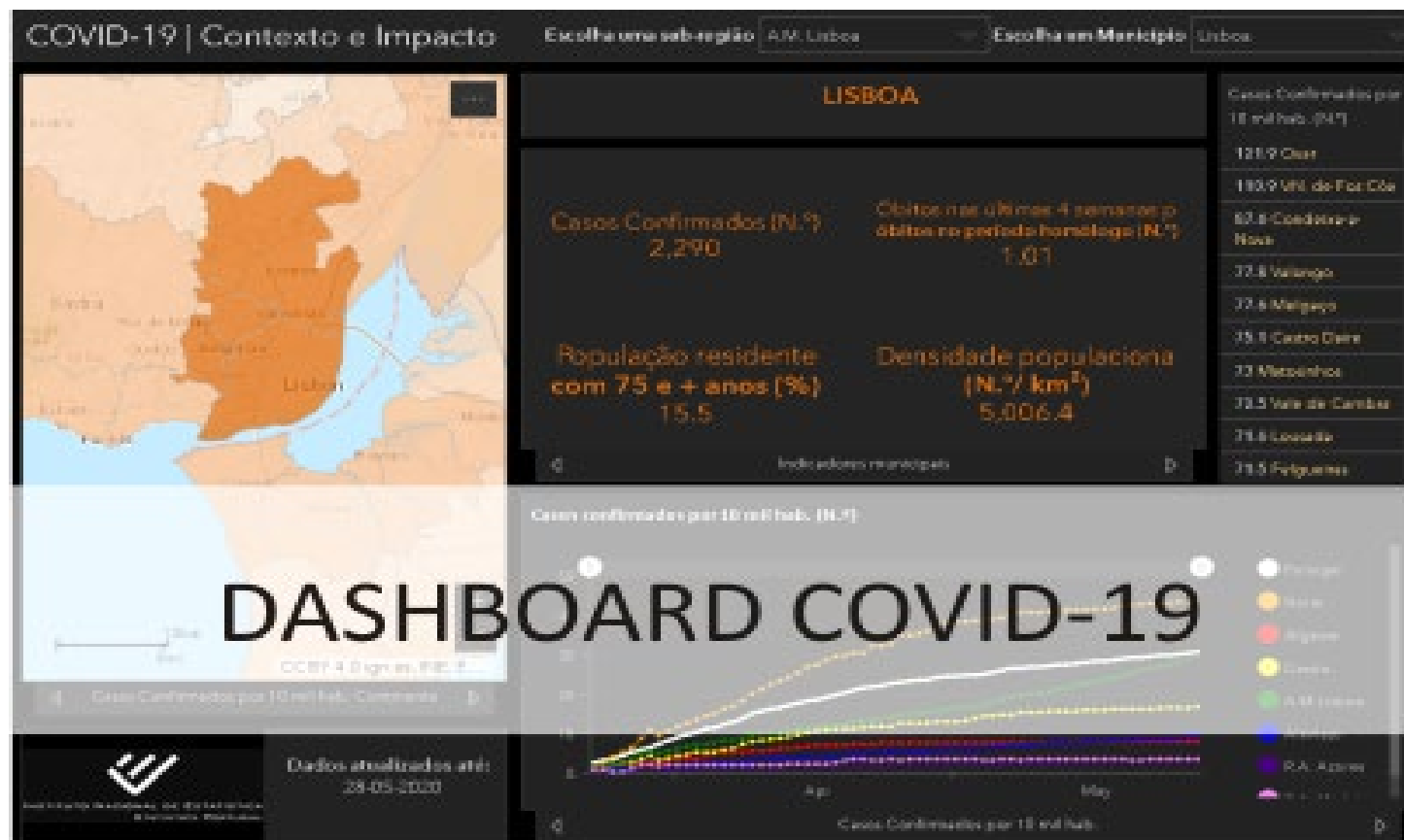
All the major industrial groupings recorded less pronounced year-on-year rates of change than in the previous month, particularly *Investment Goods* with a recovery of 22.2 p.p.
