Back to interviewing: rules

Basic rules:

- Keep 1.5 meters distance (2 arm lengths).
- Risk groups must explicitly agree to a face-to-face interview.
- When possible, interview outside.
- Disinfect your hands regularly, especially after contact with objects or surfaces.
- If desired, use a face mask and / or gloves.
- Do not accept drinks and no visits to the toilet.
- Use your common sense.



Back to interviewing: rules

Checklist:

- Have you, or someone who lives with you, had any of the following symptoms in the past 24 hours: cough, fever, breathlessness or sudden loss of smell and taste?
- Have you had the coronavirus and has it been diagnosed in the past 7 days?
- Do you have a housemate who is infected with the coronavirus and did you have contact with this housemate less than 14 days ago while he/she still had symptoms?
- Are you in home isolation because you have had direct contact with someone who has been diagnosed with the coronavirus?
- Do you belong to a risk group? For example because of your age or a chronic illness.
- Is an interview possible from 1.5 meters away?

Back to interviewing: evaluation forms (address)

- For 80% of the interviews, it took little effort to persuade the respondent to participate.
- If the interviewer had to make an effort, Corona was not the reason.
- LFS: 60% inside, 20% outside and 20% telephone
Health: 65% inside and 35% outside
- The safety measures that are most used are: the distance rule (1.5 m) and the disinfection gel.
- None of the interviewers were worried about their own health.
- Almost none of the interrupted interviews was due to Corona.
- Health: the laptop was cleaned in all cases before the CASI-part took place.
- About 30% of the respondents indicated that they also want to conduct the interview via video calling
- 86% of the refusals was not Corona related.

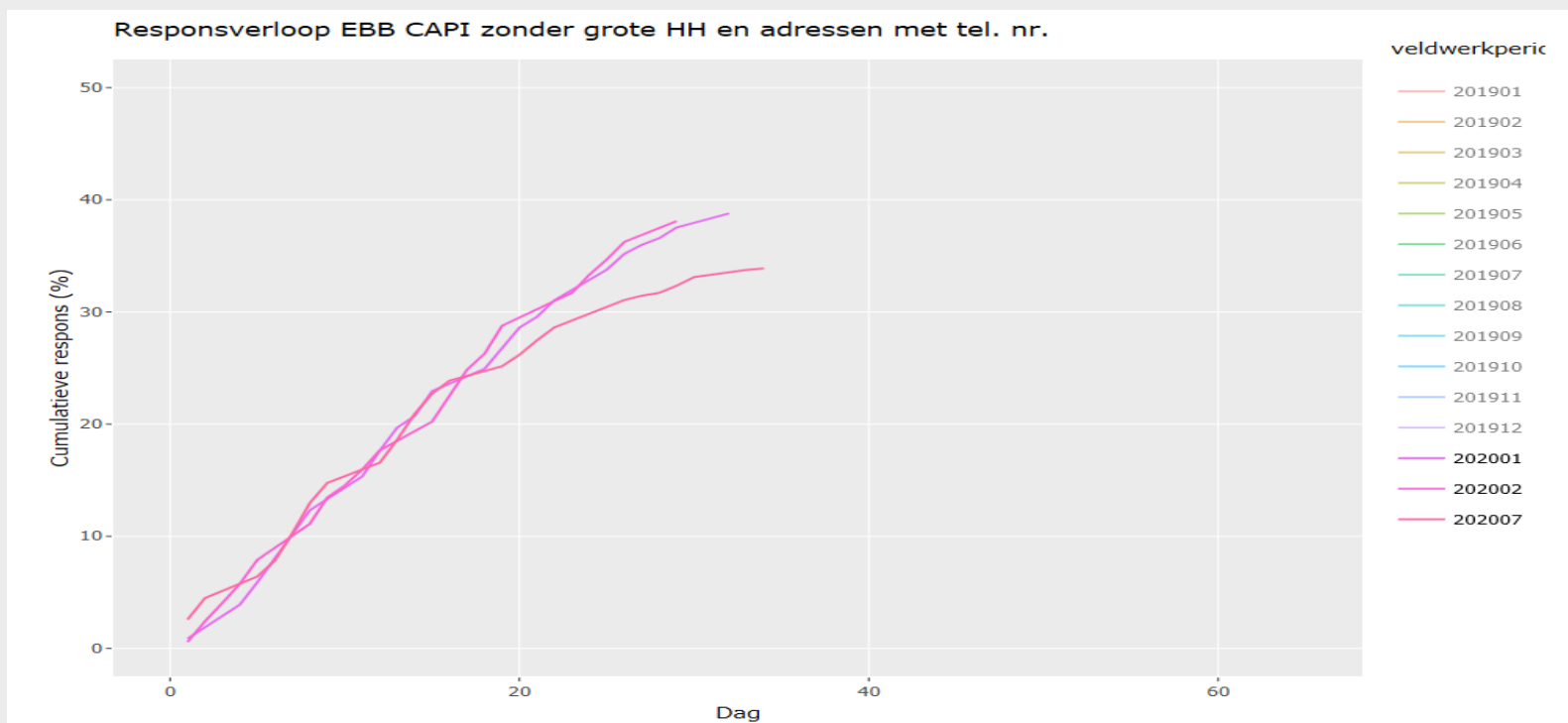


Back to interviewing: evaluation forms (global)

- 94% of the interviewers indicated that they did not mind following the safety rules.
- They all think that Statistics Netherlands took enough measurements.
- Almost every interviewer states that they have received enough materials.
- The question “what are your experiences with this kind of interviewing?” was almost always answered by “not a lot of difference”.
- There are no groups that stand out because they were now less likely to cooperate or because they had difficulty with the safety protocols.
- Most respondents were not concerned about their own health because of the interview

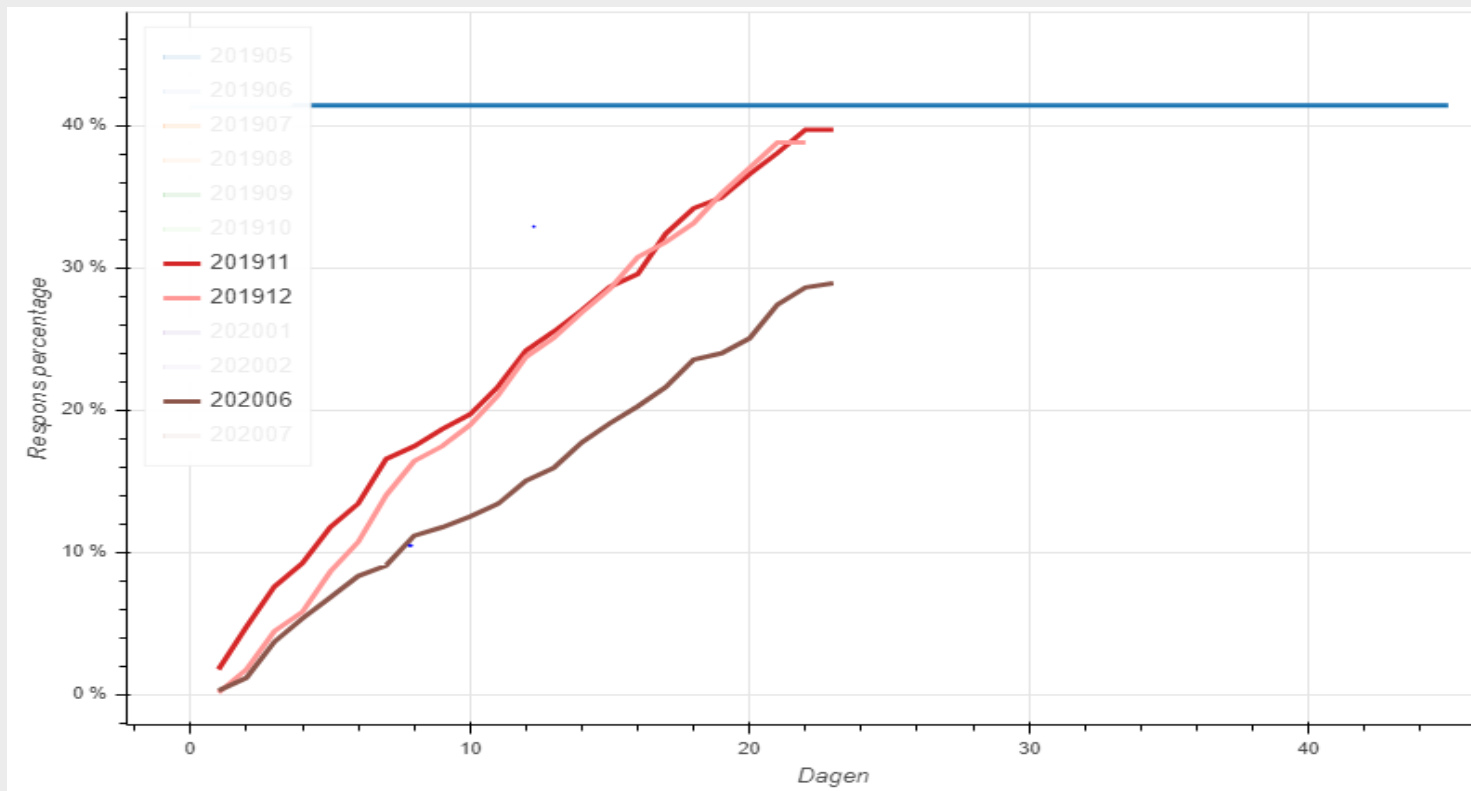
