## MARKET DEVELOPMENTS IN 2002 AND PROSPECTS FOR 2003

(Item 3 of the provisional agenda)

Note by the secretariat

This document contains the schedule for the forest products markets discussions and the preparation of the market statement. The document requests timely submission of national market statements and forest products forecasts. The Committee is invited to:

- discuss developments in forest products markets;
- draft a market statement for issue after the session;
- comment on the Forest Products Annual Market Review.

### TIMETABLE AND ORGANIZATION OF THE MARKET DISCUSSIONS

- 1. The annual market discussions at the Timber Committee Session have been expanded to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  days beginning in 2001 to enable more discussion time and comprehensive coverage of forest products markets. Discussions are scheduled to begin in the afternoon on Tuesday 24 September 2002 and for the full day on 25 September 2002. The theme will be "Market effects of wood promotion."
- 2. Each forest products market segment will be introduced by a secretariat analysis comparing developments in the 3 subregions, i.e. CIS, Europe and North America. These analyses are based on responses to the 2002-2003 Timber Committee forecasting questionnaire. The secretariat introduction will be followed by expert presentations for each sector. After the introduction and presentations, the participants at the market discussions will be invited to discuss the trends and developments.
- 3. The timetable below may be adjusted according to length of discussions on individual market segments. The order of presentations is from the demand for products to the raw material markets. A detailed schedule of speakers and timing will be presented at the session.

### PREPARATION OF THE COMMITTEE'S MARKET STATEMENT

4. The following timetable for preparing and approving the Committee's market statement and press release is proposed:

draft (as there will be no formal interpretation on Friday morning, the secretariat proposes that the Drafting Committee be conducted in

English).

- afternoon The draft statement is submitted for approval by the Timber

Committee. Because there is no time for translation, the statement will

only be available in English.

Following week Text of statement issued as press release and put on the Committee website

with a summary table of regional forecasts for markets in 2002 and

2003.

5. The Committee's market statement will be published in the *Timber Bulletin* No.6 "Forest products markets in 2002 and prospects for 2003", with complete sector tables with national forecasts and posted on the website. Market discussion speakers' presentations will also be uploaded to the website following the session.

6. In previous years the following countries have been represented at the Drafting Committee: Austria, Canada, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Netherlands, Poland, Russian Federation, Sweden, United Kingdom and United States of America. However, every country is welcome to participate. As usual, the drafting committee will have a secretariat draft of the market statement at its disposal.

#### COUNTRY MARKET STATEMENTS

- 7. Delegations' written and electronic market statements are imperative to the success of the market discussions as they provide the only means of ensuring that all countries' market developments are announced to the other delegations and the secretariat (there is not sufficient time during the session to enable all individual country presentations. They should be received by **14 September 2002**, by e-mail, and will be posted on the website. Suggestions for format and transmission arrangements will be sent to delegations and posted on the website. Delegations' attention is drawn to the explanatory notes for the Provisional Agenda (ECE/TIM/98) in relation to item 3.
- 8. In particular, delegations are reminded to send 120 copies of their written statements on developments in their forest products markets to the secretariat by **14 September 2002**. If it is not possible to transmit all 120 copies by the deadline, delegations are requested to bring them to Geneva. However the electronic version (or as last

The Timber Committee places high priority on "review of short-term forest products market developments and prospects" (09(B).1.3, priority 2 of programme of work) and "collection of forest products statistics and publication of the *Timber Bulletin*", (priority 1 of the programme of work). The secretariat feels that the ability to fulfil these most important mandates is directly contingent on prompt and complete replies to the questionnaires, as refined and endorsed by member countries. Delegations are reminded that the deadline for replies to the Timber Committee Questionnaire is **1 September 2002** and are requested to ensure that this deadline is adhered to.

10. It is impossible to prepare the Committee's statistics and reports in time for the meeting unless all forecasts are received by the deadline. The nature of the data for the market discussion (forecasts for the current and forthcoming year) means that they cannot be based on full knowledge, unlike, for instance the historical data requested through the Joint Forest Sector Questionnaire (JFSQ). Therefore, it is acknowledged that figures supplied by national correspondents are **estimates**. When using these forecasts the secretariat consistently acknowledges their nature as estimates and notes *when* they were made to minimize misunderstanding.

#### FOREST PRODUCTS ANNUAL MARKET REVIEW, 2001-2002

11. The "Forest Products Annual Market Review, 2001-2002", *Timber Bulletin*, Volume LV (2002), Number 3, will be published ahead of the session in English. It is intended to serve as a background document for the session's market discussions. To ensure timely distribution to delegates, it is placed on the Committee's website (http://www.unece.org/trade/timber). As the full *Market Review* will not be available in French and Russian, an executive summary will be produced in all 3 languages and will be available on the website and at the market discussions.

12. Delegates will find several special chapters in the *Review* and it is anticipated that some of their authors will give presentations during the market discussions. Delegates may suggest subjects for future special chapters, either current issues, new developments, trends or specific ECE or non-ECE forest products markets. Comments on the *Review* are welcomed by the secretariat.

## TEAM OF SPECIALISTS ON FOREST PRODUCTS MARKETS AND MARKETING

13. The team will hold its second meeting just before the Committee session, 23-25 September 2002, and team members will contribute to the Committee market discussions, 24-25 September 2002. The Committee will be informed of the results of the team's meeting (under item 7 of the provisional agenda) and invited to make preliminary comments.
