



Consumption of primary products










UNECE region's share of consumption






Export of primary products





UNECE region's share of exports



UNECE region's share of production



UNECE region's trade balance











UNECE region's imports

Where in the world is the UNECE?!

- Majority of world's temperate forests
 - Growing more than consuming
- Consumption and production growing
- Major producing and consuming region of world's primary wood products
 - Produces 63 to 85%
 - Consumes 60 to 80%
- Trade increasing, and major trading region
 - Exports 75 to 90% of world
 - Imports 60 to 80%
- Net exporter for most products
