Cluster 1: Forest resources

Expected Accomplishment

Increased ability to measure and report on forest resources as the underlying basis for sustainable forest management.

Indicator of Achievement

Increased percentage of UNECE countries able to provide satisfactory data on quantitative indicators of sustainable forest management.

Baseline 2008-2009: 70 per cent

Target 2010-2011: 67 per cent

Achievement 2010-2011: 78 per cent



Cluster 1: Forest resources

Results & Lessons Learned:

- ✓ Significant improvement in the quantity and quality of collected data
- ✓ Role of Criteria and Indicators (C&I) reaffirmed as a key tool
- ✓ A better interlinking of reporting on the regional C&I for SFM with the data collection on the global variables



Draft Stategic Framework 2014-2015

- Strategy (selected examples)
- ✓ Develop and apply analytical and monitoring tools
- ✓ Collect, validate and disseminate information and analysis
- ✓ Promote SFM and the sound and legal use of forest products, for raw material and energy as well as forest services
- ✓ Capacity-building activities (Eastern Europe, the Caucasus, Central Asia and the Mediterranean region) to implement SFM
- ✓ Regional international cooperation and interregional cooperation
