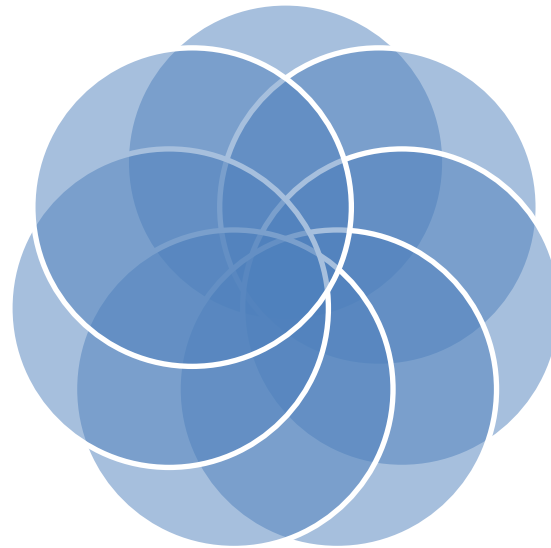

New UNDA project concept note for CCA approved

Full project document developed by October 2015

Budget 501,000 USD; Timeframe 2016-2017

Target countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan

Focus: Development of SEMAFOR (System for assessing sustainability of monitoring SFM) including data collection
