The Action Plan proposes major deliverables: a so called "hand book with recommendations" and "seminars and workshops" which should help to spread the information throughout the involved countries and ensure excellent knowledge transfer and enhanced capacity building.

10. Comments, lessons learned:

There are many actors and institutions working on the issues of forestry and the green economy. The work in progress done by the ToS should be given an official character (mandate) in order that the team members can adequately liaise with other relevant institutions and specialists. This should ensure that outputs are efficiently and effectively delivered and that there is no duplication of effort.
