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Strategic Framework 2020-2021**Subprogramme 07: Forests and the Forest Industry¹****Note by the Secretariat***Summary*

The Strategic Framework 2020-2021 is the principal policy directive for the ECE subprogramme on Forests and the Forest Industry. The biennial programme plan contains a short narrative highlighting the overall raison d'être of the programme, in addition to a logical framework detailing its constituent subprogrammes and strategy.

The draft Strategic Framework 2020-2021 is based on the Strategic Framework 2018-2019. It was prepared by the ECE Secretariat and endorsed by Bureau of the ECE Committee on Forests and the Forest Industry (COFFI).

I. Objectives for the biennium, expected accomplishments, indicators of achievement and performance measures

Objective of the Organization: To strengthen sustainable management of forests in the ECE region, and their contribution to sustainable development and the provision of economic and environmental benefits for present and future generations.²

II. Strategy

1. The responsibility for the subprogramme is vested in the Forests, Land and Housing Division. The objective of the subprogramme will be achieved through international policy dialogue, analytical and normative work, capacity-building and the dissemination of best practices and lessons learned.
2. The subprogramme will provide a platform for policy dialogue on forest-related issues while taking into account a rapidly changing policy environment, notably related to climate change and bioenergy. The subprogramme will develop and apply analytical and monitoring tools to support evidence-based policymaking to underpin sustainable forest management and the sustainability of the forest industry. The subprogramme will collect, validate and disseminate information and the results of research and analysis; facilitate the exchange of national experiences and best practices; and monitor progress on achieving sustainable forest management using key forest-sector indicators. The subprogramme will support the implementation of the Rovaniemi Action Plan for the Forest Sector in a Green Economy in order to promote the role of the forest sector in a green economy and in mitigation of and adaptation to climate change.
3. The subprogramme will promote the sustainable management of forests and the sound and legal use of forest products (including raw material, energy, and forest ecosystem services), based on appropriate best available scientific knowledge, policies and institutions. Priorities for 2020-2021 will be guided primarily by the outcomes of the joint session of the ECE Committee on Forests and the Forest Industry and the FAO European Forestry Commission (Las2017). The sub-programme will support the implementation in the ECE region of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests (2017-2030) and the related Global Forest Goals approved by the General Assembly in April 2017. The subprogramme will also support the development of cross-sectoral and cross-institutional policies promoting sustainable forest management and enhanced forest governance in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by (a) supporting sustainable management of forests and the sustainability of the forest industry, and (b) monitoring the status of forests and forest products and their effect on climate change mitigation, biodiversity conservation, provision of sustainable energy and fibres, etc.
4. As part of the implementation strategy of the subprogramme, ECE will carry out its work in partnership with FAO, and in cooperation with the European Forest Institute, Forest Europe and other relevant regional organizations and processes. The subprogramme will provide regular input to the United Nations Forum on Forests and the FAO Committee on Forestry.
5. To support forest management, including the provision of forest services and the use of wood and forest products which are ecologically, economically and socially sustainable, the subprogramme will: (a) encourage all relevant stakeholders to participate in and implement the activities of the subprogramme and (b) take a cross-sectoral approach to ensure that the strategy is well integrated into the policy framework of other sectors. Achieving sustainable forest management is primarily a national responsibility, so the subprogramme and its partners will support national-level efforts by: (a) developing and disseminating concepts, information and specific studies, (b) sharing experiences and providing capacity-building and (c) by defining measurement standards and policy tools.

II. External factors

6. The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) there is active country and stakeholder participation; (b) partnership with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) continues, including the provision of staff and non-staff resources, to implement the integrated ECE/FAO programme of work in this area; and (c) in kind and cash support from member States to the implementation of planned activities is sustained.
