**Draft programme of work of the Forestry and Timber
subprogramme for 2020****Note by the Secretariat***Summary*

The present document sets out the draft programme of work of the Forestry and Timber subprogramme for 2020.

The Committee is invited to review and adopt the draft programme of work of the Forestry and Timber subprogramme for 2020 and recommend it to the Executive Committee for approval.



Introduction

1. The present document sets out the draft programme of work of the Forestry and Timber subprogramme (“the subprogramme”) for 2020. The Committee on Forests and the Forest Industry (“the Committee”) is invited to adopt it and recommend to the Executive Committee (Excom) for approval. Any subsequent additional, discontinued or carried over outputs will be reflected in UN Umoja system used by the Secretariat for planning, monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the programme.
2. The draft programme of work applies a results-based management (RBM) approach, a broad management approach which establishes logical relationship between the hierarchical results (deliverables – objectives – impact) known as ‘results chain’, the resources (human and financial) known as ‘inputs’ and the external factors (strategic, governance, operational, financial) which can prevent from achieving the objective.
3. The objective, the most significant planned result and the deliverables in the draft programme of work correspond to those contained in the ECE proposed programme budget for 2020. The objective of the subprogramme is aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In attaining its objective, the subprogramme builds on cross-sectoral collaboration with other subprogrammes in relevant ECE nexus areas where multiple SDGs converge¹. This type of collaboration enables the subprogramme to maximize existing synergies, increase the efficiency of its work and have a multiplying effect on the impact of its actions to support countries to implement SDGs. The deliverables of the subprogramme fall into the following main categories: (a) facilitation of the intergovernmental process and expert bodies; (b) generation and transfer of knowledge, including technical cooperation projects, training events, seminars, workshops, and publications; (c) other substantive deliverables, and (d) communication deliverables.
4. The details of the proposed publications are provided in Annex I. The overall ECE legislative mandates and those specific for the subprogramme are listed in Annex II.

I. Objective and alignment with SDGs

5. The objective, to which the subprogramme contributes, is to strengthen sustainable management of forests and enhance the contribution of forests and forest products to sustainable development in the ECE region.
6. The objective is aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 7, which is to ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all. Progress towards the attainment of the objective will help to increase substantially the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix.
7. The objective is also aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 11, which is to make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable. Progress towards the attainment of the objective will reduce the adverse per capita environmental impact of cities.
8. Furthermore, the objective is also aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 12, which is to ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns. Progress towards the attainment of the objective will help to achieve the sustainable management and efficient use of natural resources
9. Finally, the objective is also aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 15, which is to protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss. Progress towards the attainment of the objective will help to promote the implementation of sustainable management of all types of forests, halt deforestation, restore degraded forests and substantially increase afforestation and reforestation globally. Furthermore, it will help to ensure the conservation, restoration and sustainable use of

terrestrial and inland freshwater ecosystems and their services, in particular forests, in line with obligations under international agreements.

10. Alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals serves as a framework for contributing to the objective of the subprogramme. Within this framework, the subprogramme will develop cross-sectoral activities with other ECE subprogrammes where there is complementarity between the respective Sustainable Development Goals and targets in line with the nexus areas described in paragraph 3 above.

II. Highlighted planned result for 2020

11. ECE member States account for 40 per cent of the global forest. Over the past 70 years, the subprogramme collected data on the state of forests and their management. Following the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals, there was a need for a more specific focus on reporting on the achievement of Goal 15. For the region, the collection of the data relating to the Goal is undertaken by the subprogramme in cooperation with FAO, the custodian agency.

12. In 2018, at the request of member States, a new reporting system containing, for the first-time, indicators to measure targets 15.1 and 15.2 was launched and guidance on reporting was provided through three face-to-face training sessions for national correspondents, covering the entire ECE region.

Challenge and response

13. The challenge for countries was their limited national capacity to collect and validate high-quality data.

14. In response, for 2020, ECE plans to provide capacity-building support and advisory assistance to national correspondents, who are responsible for reporting on Sustainable Development Goal indicators. For 2020, it is envisioned that all data will be compiled by the subprogramme, allowing for a precise picture of the state of forests and forest management in the region.

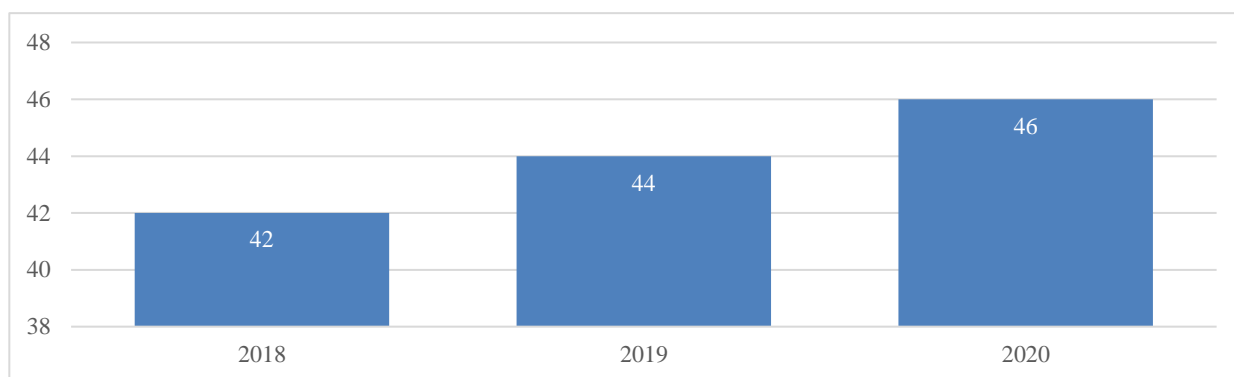
Result and evidence

15. The planned deliverable is expected to contribute to the result, which is extensive and high-quality, standardized data, which will provide information with respect to the achievement of Goal 15, targets 15.1 and 15.2, on sustainable forest management for all countries in the region. This will make it possible to identify and address specific challenges in the achievement of those targets.

16. Evidence of the result, if achieved, will include the increased response rate of 46 countries reporting high-quality data, as shown in the figure below. This information will also feed into such global and regional publications as the Global Forest Resources Assessment, the *State of Europe's Forests*, the European Forest Sector Outlook Study, reports of the United Nations Forum on Forests and media coverage. The results will also allow better planning of future capacity-building activities to countries facing challenges in meeting targets 15.1 and 15.2.

17. The result, if achieved, will demonstrate progress made in 2020 towards the collective attainment of the objective. It will contribute to the nexus area on measuring and monitoring the Sustainable Development Goals.

III. External factors

18. The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objective on the assumption that there is continued: (a) active country and stakeholder participation; (b) partnership with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), including the provision of staff and non-staff resources, to implement the integrated ECE/FAO programme in this field; and (c) in kind and cash support from member States to the implementation of planned activities.
